AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of 114th Place N.E. V-1801 Petitioner: Lincoln Property Company and Others

STATEMENT OF FACTS

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1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of 114th Place N.E., hereinafter described.

- 2. The Department of Public Works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements have been secured by the Northeast Lake Washington Sewer and Water District.
- 3. The Division of Building and Land Development has studied the subject proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed road vacation.
- 4. The Department of Public Works presently recognizes
 N.E. 132nd Street as a secondary arterial. As such, total right
 of way width should be 84 feet. There is presently 60 feet of
 right of way deeded to King County. The Department of Public
 Works feels the additional right of way required by road standards
 for this street should be secured from Tax Lots 61 and 32 in
 exchange for the area described in this petition. The legal
 description for this roadway vacation has been revised to provide
 for the retention of the needed right of way 42 feet North of
 the centerline of N.E. 132nd Street.
- 5. There presently exists within the proposed vacation area a paved roadway surface. This surface was constructed by the Washington State Department of Transportation and turned back to King County for the purpose of providing access to the abutting properties. King County does not maintain this road surface.

- 6. The Department of Public Works is agreeable to vacating the subject right of way as the petitioners are the owners of all abutting properties. This agreement is conditioned on the petitioners providing King County with an easement for the maintenance of existing traffic signal detector loops on the roadway. King County is now in receipt of two signed instruments from Lincoln Woodlake Limited Partnership: (1) A Quit Claim Deed for 3,753 square feet of area which gives the County the additional 12 feet required for the widening of N.E. 132nd Street; and (2) A Traffic Control Easement for the maintenance of existing traffic signal detector loops on the roadway.
- 7. The Department of Public Works considers the remainder of the right of way, addressed in the provided legal description, useless as part of the County road system and believes the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls. In accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759, the vacation area is classified "A" Class. The amount judged to be fair compensation for the proposed road vacation is \$35,543.00. This amount was determined by the assessed value per square foot of the adjoining land. King County is now in receipt of \$35,543.00 from Lincoln Property Company N.C., Inc.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County Council on the $\underline{1946}$ day of $\underline{\text{Aeptember}}$, 1983.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition
