ORDINANCE NO. 6911

AN ORDINANCE relating to the annexation of an area known as 80-5 to Southwest Suburban Sewer District.

## STATEMENT OF FACT:

- l. A notice of intention proposing the annexation of an area known as 80-5 to Southwest Suburban Sewer District was filed with the county council effective July 20, 1984.
- 2. Southwest Suburban Sewer District has found the petition for annexation to be sufficient and has, by Resolution No. 84-51 concurred with the proposed annexation.
- 3. Southwest Suburban Sewer District filed a Declaration of Non-significant Impact dated June 21, 1984, on the proposed annexation.
- 4. The county council held a public hearing on the 20 Hday of august, 19 84 and has considered the criteria set forth in R.C.W. 56.02.060.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The annexation of Southwest Suburban Sewer District of the area known as 80-5 and described in Section 4 herein is approved. This proposed annexation is consistent with R.C.W. 56.02.060 as described in the attached King County Council Annexation Report on 80-5.

SECTION 2. The Southwest Suburban Sewer District is the appropriate entity to serve the area proposed to be annexed.

SECTION 3. Completion of this annexation does not constitute county approval or disapproval of any other permits, franchises, certifications, or actions necessary to provide service to this annexation area, nor does it authorize sewer service in any area not designated as a "Local Service Area" by the King County Sewerage General Plan.

The area known as 80-5 to be annexed is described
