ORDINANCE NO. 6994

AN ORDINANCE granting the appeal of the applicant and approving the application for the proposed plat of CANTERWOOD, designated Building and Land Development File No. 784-1.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

The council finds that the report of the SECTION 1. zoning and subdivision examiner dated August 8, 1984, which was filed with the clerk of the council on August 16, 1984, contains an error in judgment and erroneously concludes that action on this application should be deferred.

The council adopts findings nos. 1 through 4 SECTION 2. (including the findings of the building and land development division incorporated therein by reference) of the said report and recommendation, and further finds that additional information concerning the proposed methods of sewage disposal and storm water control will be presented to the appropriate administrative agencies prior to final plat approval.

SECTION 3. The council adopts the conclusions of the said renort and recommendation.

The proposed plat of Canterwood is granted SECTION 4. preliminary approval, subject to the following conditions for final plat approval:

- Compliance with all platting regulations of Title 19 of the King County code.
- All persons having an ownership interest in the subject property shall sign on the face of the final plat a dedication which includes the language as set forth in King County council motion no. 5952.
- 3. The dimensions of all lots shall meet the minimum requirements of the SE zone classification, or shall be as shown on the face of the approved preliminary plat, whichever is (Minor lot-line revisions are permitted.) greater.
- Storm drainage plans shall be approved by the department of public works; surface water management division.

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drainage plans shall comply with the provisions of chapter 20.50 of the King County code.

a. Prior to recording of the final plat and/or before making any improvements on the property such as land clearing and/or other construction including landfills, buildings, pavement, sidewalks and driveways, the following is required (unless otherwise approved by the surface water management division):

Those portions of the total storm water retention/detention facilities necessary to accommodate the control of flows discharging from the subject site as set forth in King County ordinance no. 2281, as amended, must be constructed and in operation.

- b. Additionally, prior to recording of the final plat the balance of the facilities must be constructed unless covered by an appropriate construction bond.
- 5. Provide and maintain oil/sediment separation facilities to insure such contaminants from the site do not enter the natural drainage system.
- 6. Provide and maintain drainage, erosion, and sediment control facilities to insure sediment laden water does not enter the natural drainage system. These facilities must be in operation prior to clearing and building construction, and satisfactorily maintained until construction and landscaping are completed and the potential for on-site erosion has passed.
- 7. All retention/detention ponds required pursuant to chapter 20.50 of the King County code may be required to be located in separate tracts with a drainage easement for maintenance. If the pond is not adjacent to a roadway, a fifteen (15) foot crushed rock roadway within an easement for ingress and egress will be required between the pond and roadway.
- 8. The applicant must obtain approval of the King County fire marshal for the adequacy of the fire hydrant, water main,

and fire flow standards of chapter 17.08 of the King County code.

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9. The development shall conform to ordinance nos. 4938, 5824 and 5940 ordinances relating to surface water runoff policies.

- 10. All construction and ungrading of public and private roads shall be done in accordance to the standards established and adopted by ordinance no. 4463.
- 11. If an area-wide fire protection assessment is authorized by King County ordinance prior to final recording of this plat, this plat shall be subject to any assessment provided by that ordinance.
- 12. The maximum slope of roads in the subdivision shall be 15%.
- 13. The radius of N.E. 169/167 N.E. adjacent to lot 4 shall be lengthened to 300 \pm . Details to be worked out with public works.
- 14. The access serving lots 25 and 26 shall be designated as a tract. Provide a 30 foot wide access tract with a 20 foot wide paved section. Details to be worked out with public works.
- 15. Lots with slopes of 30% and over shall be a minimum of 35,000 square feet in area.
- 16. The recommendations in the On-Site Sewage Disposal report prepared by Triad Associates dated January 20, 1984, shall be incorporated as conditions of approval.
- 17. The comments of the surface water management division memo dated June 26, 1984 shall be addressed in the final road and drainage plans.
- 18. A pedestrian/equestrian trail easement shall be provided consistent with the Northshore Communities Plan, at locations
