

ORDINANCE NO. 07032

2 AN ORDINANCE relating to a temporary moratorium  
3 on the issuance of conditional use permits and  
4 building permits for public utilities for radio  
5 frequency electromagnetic transmitters, and  
6 appurtenances on Vashon and Maury Islands,  
7 amending Ordinance 6765, Sections 2 and 4.

8 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

9 SECTION 1. Ordinance 6765, Section 2 is hereby amended as  
10 follows:

11 Moratorium established. There is hereby established a  
12 moratorium which prohibits the issuance of conditional use  
13 permits as defined by KCC 21.44.030 and building permits for  
14 public utilities in R, S, G, B, C, M, A, FR, and QM zones for  
15 (~~radio, microwave, or television~~) radio frequency  
16 electromagnetic transmitters, (~~television~~) and appurtenances on  
17 Vashon and Maury Islands.

18 For purposes of this ordinance the term "radio frequency  
19 electromagnetic transmitters" shall mean any antenna, facility  
20 or equipment designed to generate radio waves with the  
21 frequency range of 3 MHz to 100 GHz.

22 SECTION 2. Ordinance 6765, Section 4 is hereby amended as  
23 follows:

24 Implementation. All bonafide applications for conditional  
25 use permits and building permits for public utilities for  
26 (~~radio, microwave, or television~~) radio frequency  
27 electromagnetic transmitters, (~~television~~) and appurtenances  
28 and appurtenances pending as of the effective date of this  
29 ordinance shall be processed in the normal manner within  
30 normally prescribed deadlines. However, no new applications

1 for conditional use and building permits as described in Section 2  
2 of this ordinance will be accepted by King County.
