ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE making an appropriation in the amount of \$56,985 to the Planning Division from the Current Expense Fund Special Programs, Executive Contingency; for the purpose of undertaking a Highline Community Plan update; and appropriating \$109,950 to CIP Project No. 070325, North Sea-Tac Park, from a transfer from CIP Project No. 080167, Highline 14; for the purposes of undertaking a North Sea-Tac Park master plan and for future park improvements; appropriating \$30,000 to CIP Project No. 070327, Sea-Tac Clear Zone Fencing, from a transfer from CIP Project No. 080167, Highline #14 for the purpose of constructing fences around Sea-Tac Airport clear zones; appropriating \$5,000 to CIP Project No. 010020, Chelsea Community Center, from a transfer from CIP Project No. 080167, Highline #14, for the purpose of replacing the electrical distribution panel; and amending Ordinance No. 7027, Sections 23,37, 83 and 84 as amended.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of \$56,985 to the Planning Division from the Current Expense Fund Special Programs, Executive Contingency for the purpose of undertaking a Highline Community Plan update.

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 7027, Section 23, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 4. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of \$109,950 to CIP Project No. 070325, North Sea-Tac Park, from a transfer from CIP Project No. 080167, Highline 14; for the purpose of undertaking a North Sea-Tac Park master plan update in conjunction with Highline Community Plan update and to provide funds for future park improvements.

SECTION 5. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of \$30,000 to CIP Project No. 070327, Sea Tac Clear Zone Fencing, from a transfer from CIP Project No. 080167, Highline 14; for the purpose of constructing fencing around Sea-Tac Airport clear zones in cooperation with the Port of Seattle.

SECTION 6. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of \$5,000 to CIP Project No. 010020, Chelsea Community Center, from a transfer from CIP Project No. 080167, Highline 14, for the purpose of replacing the center's electrical distribution panel.

SECTION 7. Ordinance No. 7027, Section 83, as amended, is hereby amended to read as follows:

PROVIDED THAT the Public Works Director shall, in cooperation with the Budget Office, develop detailed schedules and workplans for implementing the 1985 CIP. These schedules and workplans shall include the scheduling of additional CM & I staff added in the 1985 budget and be completed and submitted for Council review prior to February 15, 1985.

PROVIDED THAT the Executive shall develop formal procedures for the administration of the Road CIP Cost Model Construction Project. Procedures shall include the process for allocating funds to eligible projects including review of need. Procedures shall also provide for reporting of such planned project allocations to the Council. PROVIDED THAT no later than April 2, 1985 the Executive shall provide a report on the status of the pathway program and a proposed 1985 work program, by project. This report should also include an evaluation and recommendation on the continued use of county forces or private contractors for this program. This evaluation shall include a summary of expenditures by option for 1983 and 1984 as well as total costs for each completed project during that period.

PROVIDED THAT in the event a Road Service District Program is implemented in 1985, up to \$500,000 from the Roads CIP Cost Model Contingency would be available to fund King County's Project Matching Share in the Road Service District Program. All funds from the sale of surplus property authorized in Motion 6105 shall be deposited to the Road Service District Matching Fund.

PROVIDED THAT the Executive shall work with representatives from Tukwila, Kent and Auburn on the development of the Green River Park Master Plan and report to the Council on recommended trail route alignment, land acquisition strategies and costs on or before October 15, 1985.

PROVIDED THAT not withstanding the provisions of Section 1 and 2 of this ordinance, Section 83 shall become effective 10 days after the Executive's approval as provided in the King County Charter.

PROVIDED FURTHER THAT pursuant to the legal requirements of RCW 39.34 the Executive shall obtain prior to Council approval, by motion, for the purposes of entering into joint funding of Road CIP projects with any municipality or the State. This proviso shall not apply to projects funded out of Agreements with Other Agencies Project.

PROVIDED THAT the Executive is authorized to negotiate an agreement with the Seattle Water Department for long-term County use of Lake Youngs perimeter and aquaduct corridors.

PROVIDED THAT the following CIP projects are established or increased:
