RE: Jail Supplemental Appropriation

Dear Mr. Chairman:

I am returning unsigned the enclosed Ordinance 7236, providing supplemental appropriation authority for operations in the new King County Jail.

The supplemental spending authority provided by Ordinance 7236 for the Department of Adult Detention (DAD) will provide essential capacity for transitional costs associated with training, mock operations, and moving into the new facility. The Ordinance also funds staffing and support costs associated with the need to operate the tenth floor of the facility, given higher than projected inmate population levels. We appreciate the County Council's timely action on this critical supplemental appropriation request.

We concur in the changes, recommended by Council staff, to the amount of the supplemental funds appropriated to DAD. However, the inclusion of Section 1 in Ordinance 7236, disappropriating funds from the Facilities Management Division is inappropriate as the Facilities Management Division was not addressed in the appropriations ordinance we proposed. Section 1 intends a transfer of funds among appropriation units that, under the Charter, should not occur until the fourth quarter of the year, if necessary and requested by the Executive.

While we agree with the anticipated savings figure identified in Ordinance 7236 for the Facilities Management Division, due to delays in opening the new Jail, a disappropriation of funds is neither necessary nor appropriate. As reported in the 1985 First Quarter Budget Report, we had already administratively frozen the anticipated savings.

While we disagree in principle with the disappropriation and transfer of funds intended by Ordinance 7236, since we had already instituted prior administrative actions to freeze the anticipated savings in Facilities Management, no constructive purpose would be served by a partial veto of the Ordinance. Therefore, I am allowing Ordinance 7236 to become law without my signature. Should the anticipated savings not materialize, we will forward a supplemental appropriation to restore any necessary expenditure authority to the Facilities Management Division.
