ORDINANCE NO. 7251

AN ORDINANCE amending Ordinance No. 6354 to allow water service to Terrawood.

PREAMBLE:

On March 28, 1983 the King County council adopted Ordinance No. 6354, conditionally approving the Water District 108 Comprehensive Water Plan.

On April 2, 1985 the Utilities Technical Review Committee reviewed the Water District 108 Comprehensive Water Plan, and recommended an amendment to Ordinance No. 6354.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. King County Ordinance No. 6354, Section 1 is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 1. The Water District 108 1982 Water System Comprehensive Plan as adopted by district Resolution No. 1785 (attached) is hereby approved subject to the following conditions:

A. All "1-5 year" facilities that are within the Soos Creek Community Planning area are approved. All "5-20 year" facilities that are within the Soos Creek Community Planning are approved but may not be constructed prior to 1988 unless this approval ordinance is amended. All "saturation" facilities within the Soos Creek Community Planning Area are approved in concept only, not for construction.

B. Within the Tahoma/Raven Heights Community Planning Area of the Water District 108 system only projects number 4, 5, 7, 10, 11, and 12 described in the attached Utilities Technical Review Committee Report and Recommendation, and the 12" transmission main proposed along the Maple Valley Highway, within Section 22, Township 22 N, Range 6E, extending from approximately SE 240th Street southeasterly to approximately SE ((244th Street)) 250th Street and distribution facilities in the plat of Terrawood, are approved:

C. In addition to the facilities approved in subsection A and B above, the extension of water service to new county approved development is also approved when:

1. The extension of water service does not include new significant general purpose improvements such as pumping storage, source, or transmission mains, as limited by KCC 13.24.060.C., and

2. The facilities are designed, installed and constructed, consistent with adopted county standards.

D. No storage within the "east" portion of Water District 108 shall be constructed unless the hydraulic gradients between Water District 108 and Water District 105 are made compatible to the extent practicable, consistent with the topography of each district, the engineering design features of the water systems of each district, the financial condition of each district and the best interests of the customers of the districts.
