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ORDINANCE NO. 7305

AN ORDINANCE conditionally approving the 1984 Vashon Sewer Comprehensive Plan.

PREAMBLE:

On September 19, 1984, the Vashon Sewer District filed a Declaration of Non Significance for the proposed plan.

On October 9, 1984, the Vashon Sewer District adopted Resolution No. 221, adopting the proposed plan.

On October 29, 1984, Vashon Sewer District filed the proposed plan for review.

On November 6, 1984 and December 4, 1984, the Utilities Technical Review Committee reviewed the proposed plan and recommended withdrawal by the district.

On December 11, 1984, the Vashon Sewer District withdrew the plan.

On May 7, 1985, the Utilities Technical Review Committee met and recommended conditional approval of the Vashon Comprehensive Sewer Plan, based on the following findings:

- 1. The population projections disagree with the Vashon Community Plan.
- 2. The plan proposes to sewer the entire island.
- 3. The plan states that five-acre home sites will become an economic impossibility.
- 4. The plan discusses the use of fresh water from off-island, and a bridge to Kitsap County.
- 5. The plan proposes to serve land outside of the LSA.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The 1984 Vashon Sewer Comprehensive Plan and Developer Extension Agreement is hereby approved, given that:

- A. King County does not approve the population projections, water service and bridge plans, or service of failing septic areas as discussed in the 1984 Vashon Sewer Comprehensive Plan.
- B. The planning area as described in Chapter One is modified to delete reference to the proposed service area.
- C. Service area boundaries as described in Chapter Two are modified to coincide with the approved Local Service Area prescribed in the King County Sewage General Plan and the

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Vashon Community Plan, plus those areas included in sewer ULIDs previously approved by King County. Public sewer service is approved only in those within the sewer service area as herein described.

- D. The Vashon Sewer District is encouraged to pursue possible long-life maintenance and management of alternative waste water disposal systems located outside the approved Local Service Area. This shall include alternative community sewage systems as defined in policy V-46 of the Vashon Community Plan. Management of alternative systems is authorized within the district's planning area which for this purpose may also be considered a waste water management area and shall be in compliance with King County Board of Health regulations pertaining to on-site sewage disposal system management.
 - E. Chapters Five and Six are not approved.
- F. Eighteen months after the adoption of the Vashon

 Community Plan the Vashon Sewer District shall provide an updated plan which contains all information required by K.C.C.

 13.24 including but not limited to:
 - 1. A land use map
 - 2. A zoning map
- 3. A map of the current service area, including corporate boundaries, ULID boundaries, and the franchise area.
- 4. A description of physical and natural features; including drainage basins, topography, and septic soil suitability.
- 5. A description of existing system deficiencies and a time schedule to meet these needs.
- 6. A discussion of the district's relation to county comprehensive plans and policies.
- 7. A map of the existing and proposed system, with capacities noted.

8. A description of DOE/DSHS existing and potential Public Health Problem Areas within the service area.

G. If the Vashon Sewer District elects to undertake the management of alternative waste water disposal systems located outside the Local Service Area, a waste water management plan shall be developed pursuant to Washington State Department of Social and Health Services (DSHS) guidelines and county board of health rules and regulations. Such a plan should include a discussion of community plan policies involving on-site systems, identified health hazard areas, and alternative methods which should be used as corrective measures.

SECTION 2. The Utilities Technical Review Committee shall review the Updated Vashon Comprehensive Sewer Plan, and may then make recommendations to the King County council regarding amendments to this ordinance.
