AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of Juanita-Woodinville Way N.E. (N. Edmonds Road No. 93)

Petitioner: Lydia S. Baranzini and others V-1853

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of Juanita-Woodinville Way N.E. (N. Edmonds Road No. 93), hereinafter described.
- 2. The division of building and land development has studied the subject proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 3. The department of public works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements were granted to Northeast Lake Washington Sewer and Water District and Puget Power. Washington State Department of Transportation has requested King County to protect the state by making the vacation "subject to protection of existing utilities."
- 4. Transportation planning has reviewed the petition to vacate and recommends approval, conditioned upon the applicant dedicating 12 feet along Juanita-Woodinville Way N.E., which is a portion in the southwestern corner of the property. This would provide 42 feet of right-of-way from the centerline of Juanita-Woodinville Way N.E. King County is now in receipt of a Warranty Deed from Lydia S., Richard D. and Gary W. Baranzini.
- 5. The vacation area was maintained by King County prior to the construction of SR 405. The state relocated Juanita-Woodinville Way N.E. slightly to the northwest and provided an overpass for traffic across SR 405. In accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759, the vacation area is classified "B Class." King County is now in receipt of \$3,716.39, which is the amount judged to be fair compensation for the proposed road vacation. This amount was determined by the assessed value per square foot of the adjoining land.
- 6. The vacation area is the last remnant of the old roadway and is considered useless as part of the county road system. The department of public works believes the public would be benefited by the return of the unused area to the public tax rolls.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County Council on the // day of Leptenber , 19 / 5

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.
