ORDINANCE NO.

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of E. J. Curran Road (County Road No. 357), hereinafter described.
- 2. The department of public works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that an easement was granted to Puget Power.
- 3. The division of building and land development has studied the subject proposed vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed road vacation.
- 4. The vacation area was obtained by Quit Claim Deed dated April 10, 1893. The department of public works found no evidence that the vacation area has ever been open as a road. A search of the records indicates that no public funds have been expended for its acquisition, improvement or maintenance. The road is, therefore, classified "Class C" in accordance with county Ordinance No. 2759.
- 5. The department of public works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the county road system and believes the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.
- 6. The "King County Interim Plan" designates 216th Avenue Southeast as a secondary arterial adjacent to the request, and as such, will require 42 feet of right of way west of the centerline. At the present time, we have only 30 feet. Therefore, the department of public works recommends that tax lots 11, 46, and 51 deed 12 additional feet of right of way for 216th Avenue Southeast in exchange for this vacation action. King county is now in receipt of deeds for the required 12 additional feet from the respective property owners of tax lots 11, 46 and 51 (copies of deeds are enclosed.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.
