ORDINANCE NO.7589

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An Ordinance establishing a Water Utility Coordinating Committee for the South King County Critical Water Supply Area.

PREAMBLE:

On December 16, 1985 the King County council passed Motion 6407 adopting the Preliminary Assessment of Water Supply and Fire Protection Issues in King County, and pursuant to RCW 70.116 designating South King County a Critical Water Supply Area.

RCW 70.116 requires a Utility Coordinating Committee to establish the boundaries of the Critical Water Supply Area and to prepare a Coordinated Water System Plan.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. A water utility coordinating committee for the South King County Critical Water Supply Area is established for the purpose of implementing the Public Water System Coordination Act of 1977.

SECTION 2. The committee shall consist of representatives from the following agencies:

16	Each of the listed agencies shall appoint a member and an
17	alternate to the committee. Appointed members shall continue
18	to serve until replaced by the appointing authority in
19	accordance with the by-laws of the committee.
20	SECTION 3. A. In order for the committee to conduct
21	business, a quorum consisting of not less than half of the
22	appointed members shall be present.
23	B. At the first meeting of the committee, a chairperson
24	and rules for conducting business shall be determined by
25	consensus.
26	C. Within six months of its establishment, the committee
27	shall be responsible for developing and recommending external
28	critical water area boundaries to the county council in the
29	manner prescribed in WAC 248-56-600.
30	D. Following the establishment of the external bounda-
31	ries, the committee shall be responsible for developing a
32	coordinated water system plan for the critical water supply

service area in accordance with the procedures provided in 1 WAC 248-56-740. On completion of the plan, the committee shall 2 submit the plan to the Washington State Department of Social 3 and Health Services via King County which shall conduct the local review required by law. The plan shall be submitted within eighteen months of the establishment of the committee. The coordinated water system plan and external 7 critical water service area boundaries shall be reviewed and 8 updated as appropriate by the committee at a minimum of every 9 five years, or sooner if the committee deems it necessary, as 10 prescribed in WAC 248-56-760. 11 SECTION 4.
