ORDINANCE NO. _____

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AN ORDINANCE relating to housing and community development adopting King County's Community Development Block Grant Program for 1986; repealing Ordinance 7422, Section 64, as amended, adding new sections to Ordinance 7422, and decreasing the appropriation to the Community Development Block Grant Fund by \$340,267.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 7422, Section 64, as amended, is hereby repealed.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 2. The following sections are inserted in Ordinance No. 7422 in place of Section 64, as amended:

NEW SECTION. SECTION 3. The projects listed in Section 5 of this ordinance are hereby adopted and approved in the funding categories and amounts therein specified and the King County executive is hereby authorized to submit the approved projects to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, hereinafter referred to as "HUD."

Provided that:

All projects have or will receive Joint Policy Committee approval in the exact funding categories and amounts listed in this ordinance.

Provided further:

Projects identified as being funded with prior years funds in the amount of \$458,306 will be included with the 1986 CDBG Program submitted to HUD but will be shown as amendments to the appropriate program years from which funds are being made available, as required by HUD.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 4. Upon request by a consortium jurisdiction through a duly adopted resolution of such jurisdiction; and upon a determination by the housing and community development manager that such action would conform to the goals and objectives contained in the Act, the King County Community Development Block Grant Consortium Policy Plan for 1986, and the Federal CDBG Regulations contained in the Code of Federal Regulations; the housing and community development division manager may take the following actions:

1 A. Transfer "population" funds of the requesting jurisdiction between
2 Joint Policy Committee previously approved projects of the jurisdiction;

3 B. Transfer unallocated "population" funds of the requesting juris-
4 diction to any Joint Policy Committee approved project of the jurisdiction;

5 C. With the concurrence of the Joint Policy Committee, transfer unallo-
6 cated "population" funds of the requesting jurisdiction to any new project of
7 the jurisdiction which constitutes an eligible activity under the Act and
8 Regulations;

9 D. Submit to HUD for approval, as necessary, such projects approved ac-
10 cording to A, B, or C of this section.

11 NEW SECTION. SECTION 5. Community Development Block Grant - From the
12 Community Development Block Grant Fund there is hereby appropriated to:

5 B. The Blue Heron Building Rehab, project number C86808, be determined
6 CDBG eligible and 51% of project beneficiaries be low and moderate income.

7 C. The Southwest Suburban Sewer Assessments, project number C86804, is
8 funded at the level of \$50,000 as the first phase of a two phase project.

9 D. Funds recaptured from the completion of CD-2210-82 Renton Avenue
10 South Sidewalks (\$15,201) and C83301 Skyway Park Alley (\$27,170) shall be
11 transferred to C84644 Vashon Island Sidewalks (\$42,371).

12 E. The Economic Development Revolving Loan Fund of up to \$165,637,
13 project number C86684, shall not be expended without the approval of the King
14 County Council. In a motion, the County executive shall recommend program
15 objectives for 1986 and future years, if continued; staff role and plan to
16 implement the program; timeframe and organizational requirements; and loan
17 eligibility criteria.

18 F. The Historic Preservation project number C86642, includes \$4,669 for
19 the Morasch House Rehab recommended for funding by the King County Landmarks
20 Commission, January 23, 1986. These funds will be available to the Morasch
21 House Rehab project provided that the conditions set by the Commission at
22 their meeting are met by the Morasch House Group by July 31, 1986. If the
23 conditions are not met by the Morasch House Group, then the \$4,669 will be
24 transferred to project number C86804, Southwest Suburban Sewer Assessments
25 project.

26 G. If the additional 15% deferral of 1986 CDBG funds is overturned by
27 the U. S. Congress and approved by the President before July 1, 1986, the
28 original 1986 King County CDBG Program as adopted by the King County Council
29 on November 27, 1985 will be implemented. Likewise, the 1986 Consortium
30 Cities CDBG Program will be the appropriate one adopted by the Joint Policy
31 Committee on February 28, 1986 (the list of projects with a 15% cut and not
32 the 30% cut to the 1986 CDBG Entitlement.)

1 H. However, if the 15% deferral of 1986 CDBG funds is overturned after
 2 July 1, 1986 and before October 1, 1986, the following amounts will be added
 3 to the projects as listed in this Section H.
