## ORDINANCE 7748

AN ORDINANCE establishing miscellaneous fees charged by the solid waste division; including a fee for solid waste transported to Cedar Hills by the Seattle Solid Waste Utility, and identifying a per ton charge to be reserved for the energy/resource recovery program; amending Ordinance No. 7012, Section 2 and K.C.C. 10.12.010; amending Ordinance No. 7012, Section 3 and K.C.C. 10.12.020; amending Ordinance No. 6177, Section 4 and K.C.C. 10.12.025; amending Ordinance No. 7012, Section 5 and K.C.C. 10.12.040.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

NEW SECTION. SECTION 1. Effective Date. This ordinance shall take effect on December 1, 1986.

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 7012, Section 2, and K.C.C. 10.12.010 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Definitions. For the purposes of this chapter, the following definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of this chapter:

- (("Gommereial-user")) "Certificated hauler" means any person engaged in the business of solid waste handling having a certificate granted by the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission for that purpose.
- "Compacted waste" means any solid waste whose volume is less than in the loose condition as a result of containment in a closed volume under pressure.
- "Disposal site" means a land site where or facility at which permanently discarded solid waste is handled, including, but not limited to, landfills, incinerators, and transfer stations.
- "Noncommercial user" means any person not engaged in the business of solid waste handling.

 E. "Person" means individual, firm, association, partnership, political subdivision, government agency, municipality, industry, public or private corporation, or any other entity whatsoever.

- F. "Solid waste" means all putrescible and nonputrescible solid and semisolid materials discarded as a result of any industrial, commercial or agricultural operations and from community or residential activities. It does not include solids nor dissolved material in domestic sewage nor other pollutants in water resources.
- G. "Manager" means the manager of the solid waste division, King County department of public works, or his designated representative.
- H. "Uncompacted waste" means any solid waste in a loose condition.
- I. "Regional direct" means any solid waste transported to Cedar Hills disposal site by conventional long haul transfer vehicles, transporting solid waste generated and collected in King County from solid waste transfer stations.
- J. "Transfer station" means a staffed, fixed, supplemental collection and transportation facility, used by persons and route collection vehicles to deposit collected solid waste from off-site into a larger transfer vehicle for transport to a permanent disposal site.

Section 3. Ordinance No. 7012, Section 3 and K.C.C. 10.12.020 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Fees for use of disposal sites. All persons using county-operated solid waste disposal facilities shall pay the service fees set forth in the following schedule to become effective ((January-1,-1983)) December 1, 1986.

A. Service fees for the use of disposal sites with scales, excluding Cedar Hills, shall be:

Passenger licensed vehicles . ((\$-3\*50))\$ 6.50 per entry 1 Other vehicles. . . . . . ((\$26-50))\$47.00 per ton 2 Minimum charge. . . . . . . ((\$-3-59))\$ 6.50 per vehicle 3 Service fees for the use of disposal sites without scales 4 shall be based upon the cubic yard or fraction thereof as follows: 5 Passenger licensed vehicles . ((\$-3.50))\$ 6.50 per entry 6 Other vehicles 7 Compacted wastes. . . . . ((\$-7\*90))\$14.00 per cubic yard 8 Uncompacted wastes. . . . ((\$-4.49))\$ 8.00 per cubic yard 9 Minimum charge. . . . . . Any certificated hauler who has been disposing 17 solid waste at a rural landfill may be authorized by the solid 18 waste manager to dispose solid waste at the Cedar Hills Regional 19 20 Landfill on a temporary, emergency basis at the regional direct 21 fee. D. In the absence of exact weights or measurements, the 22 estimate of the manager shall be binding upon the user. 23 24 SECTION 4. Ordinance No. 6177, Section 4, and K.C.C. 25 10.12.025 are hereby amended to read as follows: 26 Replacement and/or Reclamation of Landfills. Included in the 27 rate structure listed in K.C.C. 10.12.020 of this chapter is a 28  $((\$1_{+}50))$  \$3.00 per ton charge that shall be collected for each 29 ton of solid waste collected in the King County solid waste 30 system which shall be reserved to provide for the replacement 31 and/or reclamation of King County operated landfills. 32 33

SECTION 5. Ordinance No. 7012, Section 5 and K.C.C. 1 10.12.040 are hereby amended to read as follows: 2 Special service fees for use of disposal sites. All 3 non-county residents using county-operated solid waste disposal 4 facilities shall pay the service fees set forth in the following 5 schedule: 6 A. Service fees for the use of disposal site with scales 7 shall be: 8 Passenger licensed vehicles . ((\$-5.50))\$ 8.50 per entry 9 Other vehicles. . . . . . ((\$35.09))\$55.50 per ton 10 Minimum charge. . . . . .
