ORDINANCE NO. 7952

AN ORDINANCE initiating a King County-City of Issaquah park and recreation service area for the purpose of acquiring property and making necessary capital improvements to continue operation of the Issaquah Skyport and for other recreational uses; describing the boundaries of the proposed park and recreation service area, and ordering an investigation of the feasibility and estimated costs of the proposed park and recreation service area.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. A. Formation. Under the authority given to the county by RCW 36.68.400 et seq, a park and recreation service area within the following boundaries is hereby initiated, subject to a determination of feasibility, one or more public hearings, approval of an interlocal governmental agreement, and approval by the voters within the area described:

(SE 136th St.,), thence northwesterly along said center line to the west line of Sec. 7, said Twp. 23N, R6E, W.M.; thence north along said Sec. 7 and 6, Twp. 23N, R6E, W.M., and continuing north along the west lines of Sec. 31, 30, 19, and 18, Twp. 24N, R6E, W.M. to the center of state highway I 90, thence southeasterly along said I 90 center line 1468 ft. more or less, to the easterly line of Timberlake Park projected southerly, thence northeasterly and northerly along the east margin of said Timberlake Park, to the north line of Sec. 6, Twp. 24N, R6E, W.M.; thence east to the point of beginning. All situate in King County, Washington.
- B. <u>Purpose</u>. The purpose of this park and recreation service area shall be to acquire property in the city of Issaquah known as the "Issaquah Skyport" and to make the necessary improvements thereto for continued operation of the site as a recreational airport facility, or for other park and recreational uses on the site.
- C. <u>Interlocal Agreement</u>. Implementation of the park and recreation service area shall be subject to the execution of an interlocal agreement between King County and the city of Issaquah. This agreement shall provide, among other things, that the recreational airport facility proposed under this ordinance will be owned and operated solely by the city of Issaquah and that King County will be held harmless from any liability related to the ownership or operation of such facility. It shall also provide for a change in park and recreational use in the event that operating costs of the airport facility exceed its revenues.
- D. <u>Estimated Costs</u>. The initial estimated cost of the land acquisition, capital improvements, bond issuance costs, and election costs, is \$6.5 million. These costs are proposed to be financed through issuance of general obligation bonds to be repaid through excess property tax levies. Estimated costs of operation of the park for the first year are not known at this time but shall be addressed in the feasibility study required in Section 2 of this ordinance.
- $\underline{\text{SECTION 2}}.$  The executive shall submit to the King County council no later than February 24, 1987, a study of the

feasibility of the park and recreation service area proposed in 1 this ordinance. This study shall address the feasibility of 2 forming the proposed park and recreation service area, an 3 analysis of the costs proposed to be financed through sale of bonds, an estimate and analysis of the operating costs required 5 for the first year of operation of the park, and other issues 6 germaine to the formation of this proposed park and recreation 7 service area. Upon receipt of such feasibility study, the King 8 County council shall schedule a public hearing and give proper 9 notice thereof in accordance with RCW 36.68.440. 10 SECTION 3. The executive is hereby authorized to retain as 11 bond counsel for the proposed park and recreation service area 12 the firm of Preston, Thorgrimson, Ellis & Holman which firm is 13 currently under retainer contract to serve as bond counsel for 14 King County projects. 15 SECTION 4. King County hereby acknowledges receipt of 16 Resolution 87-1 adopted by the Issaquah City council on February 17 2, 1987, requesting the King County council to form the park and 18 recreation service area and supporting inclusion of the entire 19 city of Issaquah in the proposed park and recreation service area. 20 INTRODUCED AND READ for the first time this \_\_\_\_\_\_ Z672c \_\_\_day 71 January, 1987. 22 PASSED this 9th day of Debruary 23 74

The City Council of Issaquah hereby notifies the King County Council of its support for inclusion of the entire City of Issaquah in the proposed park and recreation service area to include both the City of Issaquah and a portion of unincorporated King County for the purpose of financing the purchase, construction and improvement of the

property presently known as the Issaquah Skyport for use as park and recreation facilities to benefit the residents of said park and recreation service area. The City Council further requests the King County Council to take the necessary steps to form the park and recreation service area.
