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32 33 AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of S.W. 120th Street and adjacent walkway. (Y-1899) Petitioners: Gary J. and Joan L. Harris and Others.

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of S.W. 120th Street and adjacent walkway, hereinafter described.
- King County acquired the walkway in the dedication of the plat of the Shoremont Addition No. 1 recorded in Volume 41 of Plats, page 8, located in King County, Washington.
- 3. King County acquired Southwest 120th Street by Resolution No. 14641, dated February 15, 1954. The county purchased this property for \$4.98 and that purchase is evidenced by a deed issued to King County on April 1, 1954 and filed under Auditor's File No. 35346. The road is, therefore, classified as an "A Class" road in accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 4. The value of the portion of the road to be vacated, based upon the records of the department of assessments, is \$4,806.73.
- 5. The department of public works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that an easement was granted to the Southwest Suburban Sewer District for part of this portion of S.W. 120th Street.
- 6. An informal path currently exists on the petitioners' property. The petitioners have agreed that they will construct and maintain a trail connected to the existing neighborhood system north of the property to be vacated. The value to the county of constructing such a trail is at least \$4,806.73.
- 7. The division of building and land development has studied this proposed vacation. It found that this vacation would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans for the vicinity if a new trail linked to the existing neighborhood system were constructed.
- 8. The department of public works considers the subject right of way to be useless as part of the county road system. It also considers the walkway to be useless if an alternate is established. The department believes that if the trail is established as proposed and if the county reserves a full width easement for drainage purposes, the public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.
- 9. Gary J. and Joan L. Harris, the principal petitioners, have signed an agreement whereby they have agreed to construct and maintain a pedestrian trail over, upon and across the following described parcel of real property:

Beginning at the Northwest corner of Lot 1, Shoremont Addition No. 1, according to the plat thereof recorded in Volume 41 of Plats, Page 8, King County, Washington,

thence North 00°26'45" East for a distance of 15 feet, thence South 89°33'15" East for a distance of 129.84 feet, thence North 00°26'45" East for a distance of 6 feet, thence North 89°33'15" West for a distance of 135.84 feet, thence South 00°26'45" West for a distance of 21.00 feet,

thence South 00°26°45" West for a distance of 21.00 feet, thence South 89°33'15" East for a distance of 6 feet to the point of beginning.
