AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of South 178th Street V-1909 Petitioner: William Polk and Others

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A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of South 178th Street, hereinafter described.

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The division of building and land development has reviewed the subject proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.

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The department of public works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements were granted to Washington Natural Gas, Puget Power, and Pacific Northwest Bell.

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4. The building and land development division has studied the subject proposed road vacation and noted that South 178th Street is currently designated as a major arterial which requires 50 feet of right of way from centerline. The consensus of opinion from the agencies who responded on the department of public works notice of the proposed vacation, was that no area within 50 feet from the centerline of South 178th Street should be vacated. The department of public works has amended the enclosed legal description to retain this area.

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5. The vacation area was a county maintained road prior to the construction of I-5. Washington State Department of Transportation realigned South 178th Street during the I-5 project to a slightly southerly location and now crosses I-5 as an overpass in the new location. After the completion of I-5, the proposed vacation area was turned back to King County by Washington State Department of Transportation by Quit Claim Deed, under AF 8505070897 in accordance with GM Agreement 1131.

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The King County department of public works asked Washington State Department of Transportation to comment on the proposed vacation because of its proximity to I-5 right of way. Washington State Department of Transportation's response requests this vacation be subject to the following conditions.

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All/any existing utilities are to continue. (a)

maintain abutting area roadway.

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(b)

That the limited access control of said highway be preserved. That WSDOT is given right to cross to use gate in fence to (c)

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(d) That a slope easement be reserved in favor of WSDOT or KCW whoever will assume maintenance for area per said GM Agreement.

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Any sale, rental, transfer, vacation, etc., may be subject to the terms of said Agreement; and, that all revenue resulting from said aspects (sale, etc.) is to be placed in the King County road fund and used exclusively for road purposes.

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7. The department of public works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the county road system and believes that the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls. In accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759, the vacation area is classified "B Class." King County is now in receipt of a check in the amount of \$975.00 from the petitioner, which has been judged to be the just compensation to King County for this vacation.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County council on the 2/5t day of September 19 87.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

That portion of the Northwest 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 35, Township 23 North, Range 4 East, W.M., King County, Washington, described as follows:

Beginning at the Northeast corner of said subdivision; Thence North 87°45'57" West along the North line of said subdivision a distance of 419.14 feet to the East right of way line of the I-5 Freeway;

Thence Southerly along said right of way line on a curve to the left having a radius of 11,199.26 feet, an arc distance of 209.74 feet, through a central angle of 01°04'23" to a point 260 feet East of Highway Station PC Lw 2,481+29.2;

Thence continuing along said right of way line South 09°32'33" West a distance of 240.39 feet to the True Point of Beginning;

Thence continuing South 09°32'33" West a distance of 82.10 feet to a line 30 feet North of and parallel with the centerline of the South 178th Street Relocated Centerline, per State Highway Plan, sheet 42 of 133, State Highways Nos. 1 and 1-L, South 184th Street to South 144th Street;

Thence South 63°00'00" East along said parallel line a distance of 262.88 feet;

Thence North 47°46'03" West a distance of 297.97 feet to the True Point of Beginning;

The council, on the ,19 $\cancel{87}$  , hereby vacates and abandons the otember following described portion of South 178th Street, reserving the right to make slopes for both cuts and fills, in the future widening of South 178th Street, to a maximum width of 50 feet North of the centerline, as it now exists.

Beginning at the Northeast corner of said subdivision; Thence North  $87^{\circ}45'57"$  West along the North line of

said subdivision a distance of 419.14 feet to the East right of way line of the I-5 Freeway;
Thence Southerly along said right of way line on a curve to the left having a radius of 11,199.26 feet, an arc distance of 209.74 feet, through a central angle of 01°04'23" to a point 260 feet East of Highway Station PC Lw 2,481+29.2;

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Thence continuing along said right of way line South 09°32'33" West a distance of 240.39 feet to the True Point of Beginning;
Thence continuing South 09°32'33" West a distance of 82.10 feet to a line 30 feet North of and parallel with the centerline of the South 178th Street Relocated Centerline, per State Highway Plan, sheet 42 of 133, State Highways Nos. 1 and 1-L, South 184th Street to South 144th Street;
