- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of 37th Avenue South and South 178th Street, hereinafter described.
- 2. The department of public works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements were not required.
- 3. The building and land development division has studied the proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 4. The department of public works advises that the petition for vacation does not contain the signatures of all abutting property owners. The petitioners were unable to get the signature from the owner of the west end of the proposed vacation site. The owner, Wedgewood A Condominium, reasoned that they may want to have access from the back of their condos to 38th Avenue South. The petitioners noted that King County had vacated the south one-half of the easement in 1978. No King County office objected to this proposed vacation during the review process.
- 5. The department of public works found no evidence that the vacation area has ever been open as a road. A search of the records indicates that no public funds have been expended for its acquisition, improvement, or maintenance. The road is, therefore, classified "C Class" in accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 6. The department of public works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the county road system and believes that the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.
