

ORDINANCE NO. 8468

AN ORDINANCE relating to zoning; adding compost processing as a permitted use to the quarrying and mining classification; amending Resolution 25789, Section 2101; and K.C.C. 21.42.020.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Resolution 25789, Section 2102 and K.C.C. 21.42.020

are each amended to read as follows:

Permitted Uses. In a Q-M zone the following uses only are permitted and as herein specially provided and allowed by this chapter:

A. Quarrying and mining of minerals or materials, including, but not limited to, sand and gravel, rock, clay and peat;

B. The exploitation, primary reduction, treatment and processing of minerals or materials together with the necessary buildings, structures, apparatus or appurtenances on said property where at least one of the major mineral or material constituents being exploited is from said property, including, but not limited to, concrete batching, asphalt mixing, brick, tile, terra cotta and concrete products manufacturing plants, and rock crushers and the use of accessory minerals and materials from other sources necessary to convert the minerals or materials to marketable products;

C. The growing and harvesting of forest products, the operation of sawmills and chippers and activities and structures incidental to each;

D. Agricultural crops, open field growing, stock grazing and the harvesting of any wild crop such as marsh hay, ferns, moss, berries, etc.;

1 E. Public utility facilities;

2 F. Dwellings used and required by mining or quarrying
3 operations for continuous supervision by a caretaker or
4 superintendent and his immediate family; and dwellings on the same
5 premises which are being used for agricultural purposes, which
6 dwellings are occupied only by persons employed on the same
7 premises and their immediate families.

8 G. Compost processing limited to the receiving and processing
9 of lawn clippings, leaves, branches, limbs, stumps, scrap lumber,
10 and salvaged wood which has not been chemically treated and other
11 acceptable organic materials necessary for conversion into
12 marketable recycling/composted products.
