I understand that today the County Council deferred action on legislation related to the County's Capital Improvement Program which proportedly would enhance accounting control over capital projects administered by Facilities Management. I will await your action on that legislation before I move forward on the provisions of this Omnibus Ordinance which would affect the administration of those projects managed by Facilities Management. The Omnibus Ordinance removes from the Current Expense Fund the costs associated with the Project Management Section of Facilities Management and creates a separate fund to account for the activities of this Section.
