AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of Southwest 159th Street Petitioner: Timothy Walker and Others V-1959

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- l. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of Southwest 159th Street, hereinafter described.
- 2. The department of public works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements were granted to Southwest Suburban Sewer District, Washington Natural Gas and Seattle City Light.
- 3. The building and land development division has studied the proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 4. The Petitioner (owner of lots 15C, 16B and 17B) has petitioned King County to support a full width or partial (South 1/2 only) vacation of Southwest 159th Street. The department of public works investigation finds the right-of-way too steep for roadway consideration. The department of public works has no objection to the proposal for full width vacation.
- 5. The petitioner has provided all necessary utility easements over the subject area and supports King County's retention of a walkway easement over a portion of the South half of the right of way.
- 6. The petitioner noted in his letter of introduction of the vacation proposal, that the petition does not contain the signature of the abutting owner to the north (lot 15B). The letter also explains that the vacation is for the purpose of acquiring additional land to make both of his lots (16B and 17B) legal building lots. The petitioner feels the vacation is justified due to the steep terrain and his efforts to alleviate the concerns of the utility districts and neighborhood by his provision of easements.
- 7. The department of public works found no evidence that the vacation area has ever been open as a road. A search of the records indicates that no public funds have been expended for its acquisition, improvement or maintenance. The road is, therefore, classified "C Class" in accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 8. The department of public works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the county road system and believes that the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County council on the $\underline{\mathcal{U}}$ day of $\underline{\mathcal{W}}$ 1988.
