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4 ORDINANCE NO. **8539**

5 AN ORDINANCE establishing a higher handling
6 fee to be charged for checks returned due to
7 non-sufficient funds and amending Ordinance
8 No. 800, Section 1, as amended, and Ordinance
9 No. 7012, Section 7 and K.C.C. 10.12.010 and
10 K.C.C. 10.12.055.

11 SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 800, Section 1, as amended and
12 K.C.C. 10.12.010 are hereby amended as follows:

13 Definitions. For the purposes of this chapter, the following
14 definitions shall apply in the interpretation and enforcement of
15 this chapter:

16 A. "Certified hauler" means any person engaged in the
17 business of solid waste handling having a certificate granted by
18 the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission for that
19 purpose.

20 B. "Compacted waste" means any solid waste whose volume is
21 less than in the loose condition as a result of containment in a
22 closed volume under pressure.

23 C. "Disposal site" means a land site where or facility at
24 which permanently discarded solid waste is handled, including, but
25 not limited to, landfills, incinerators, and transfer stations.

26 D. "Noncommercial user" means any person not engaged in the
27 business of solid waste handling.

28 E. "Person" means individual, firm, association, partnership,
29 political subdivision, government agency, municipality, industry,
30 public or private corporation, or any other entity whatsoever.

31 F. "Secured load" means a load of solid waste which has been
32 secured or covered in the vehicle in a manner that will prevent
33 any part of the solid waste from leaving the vehicle while the
vehicle is moving.

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((F-)) G. "Solid waste" means all putrescible and nonputrescible solid and semisolid materials discarded as a result of any industrial, commercial or agricultural operations and from community or residential activities. It does not include solids nor dissolved material in domestic sewage nor other pollutants in water resources.

((G-)) H. "Manager" means the manager of the solid waste division, King County department of public works, or his designated representative.

((H-)) I. "Uncompacted waste" means any solid waste in a loose condition.

((I-)) J. "Regional direct" means any solid waste transported to Cedar Hills disposal site by conventional long haul transfer vehicles, transporting solid waste generated and collected in King County from solid waste transfer stations.

((J-)) K. "Transfer station" means a staffed, fixed, supplemental collection and transportation facility, used by persons and route collection vehicles to deposit collected solid waste from off-site into a larger transfer vehicle for transport to a permanent disposal site.

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 7012, Section 7, and K.C.C. 10.12.055 are hereby amended as follows:

Other fees. A. Persons shall be charged a handling fee of ((three)) fifteen dollars for each check returned due to non-sufficient funds.

1 B. Persons lacking cash at the time of disposal shall be
2 billed for the amount due. A one dollar charge for handling and
3 processing shall be added to the original fee.
