ORDINANCE NO.

8574

AN ORDINANCE appropriating \$989,493 to the planning and community development, prosecuting attorney, contracted youth services, women's program, human resources/community services administration, human services/mental health, public health pooling King County divisions, judicial administration, and work training program from the Health and Human Services Program for the council-adopted Health and Human Service Plan; amending Ordinance No. 8331, Sections 19, 26, 29, 39, 41, 43, 47, 62 and 67, as amended and adding a new section.

PREAMBLE:

In adopting the 1988 budget, the King County council created a health and human services fund, and earmarked new revenue to develop services for unincorporated area residents and to encourage the development of regional service systems. The council's health, housing, and human services committee completed a five-month work program to develop funding policies and an expenditure plan for the earmarked revenue, and in May 1988 held four public meetings to hear testimony on the proposed policies and plan. Motion 7204 adopted funding policies and a 1988-1990 expenditure plan for the Health and Human Services Program.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of \$989,493 to planning and community development, the prosecuting attorney, contracted youth services, women's program, human resources/community services administration, public health pooling King County divisions, judicial administration, and work training program from the health and human services program.

PROVIDED THAT programs and projects funded from the Health and Human Services Program shall be implemented in accordance with Motion 7204, and funds shall be expended consistent with Attachment A of this ordinance.

PROVIDED FURTHER THAT the public health department, department of human resources, and prosecuting attorney shall submit for council review and approval by motion, a detailed program description including problem statements, strategies, goals and objectives, performance/outcome measures, and an evaluation plan for each on-going program funded by the Health and Human Services Program. These statements shall be submitted to the council by August 15, 1988, except for the Child Care and Outreach to High Risk Families programs which shall be submitted no later than September 15, 1988.

PROVIDED FURTHER THAT in 1990, consistent with a council-approved evaluation plan, implementing departments or agencies shall evaluate programs funded under the Health and Human Services Program. The evaluation shall be used by the Council, in conjunction with updated needs data, to make expenditure decisions, and to determine whether the 1988-1990 funding policies need to be modified for the next expenditure period.

PROVIDED FURTHER THAT the department of human resources, judicial administration, and the planning and community development division shall submit for council review and approval by motion a detailed project description and work program for each one-time planning or evaluation project funded by the Health and Human Services Program. These descriptions shall be submitted to the council by August 15, 1988.

PROVIDED FURTHER THAT funds from this appropriation unexpended after the 13th month, 1988 shall not be carried over, but shall revert to the Health and Human Services Program fund balance.
