STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of 10th Avenue South, hereinafter described.
- 2. The department of public works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that an easement was granted to Puget Power.
- 3. The building and land development division has studied the proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 4. The vacation area was originally part of the adjacent lots in Block 41 of the Plat of Woodmont Beach. The segment of 10th Avenue South was once proposed to be a portion of an arterial roadway designated as Marine View Drive. King County obtained 10 feet of additional right-of-way on each side of 10th Avenue South in anticipation of this arterial being built in about 1934.
- 5. Marine View Drive is no longer under consideration for construction as an arterial roadway. Tenth Avenue South is presently considered a collector road and as such requires only 60 feet of right-of-way. Tenth Avenue South is a county maintained road but records indicate that the 10 foot wide vacation site was obtained at no cost by the county. The road is, therefore, classified "C Class" in accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 6. The department of public works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the county road system and believes that the public would be benefited by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

Due notice was given in the manner provided by law and a hearing was held by the King County council on the 10th day of 0 tobe 1988.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.
