ORDINANCE NO 8800

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AN ORDINANCE authorizing publication and distribution of a voters pamphlet for special elections conducted by mail ballot; amending Ordinance 8113 as amended, Section 1 and Section 2, K.C.C. 1.10.010 and 1.10.020, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

<u>SECTION 1</u>. Ordinance 8113 as amended, Section 1 and K.C.C.
1.10.010 are hereby amended as follows:

Publication and distribution. Publication and distribution of a local voter's pamphlet in conformity with the provisions of Chapter 29.81A RCW, for annual general elections held in King County and for primary and special elections as determined by the council, is hereby authorized. Authorization is specifically given for special elections for incorporations and annexations to be conducted by mail ballot. Said pamphlet shall include:

- A. All King County candidates and measures.
- B. Cities, towns, or special taxing districts located wholly within King County, which have indicated in writing that the jurisdiction's legislative authority has chosen to participate.
- C. Cities, towns, or special taxing districts located within King County and another county, if the counties have entered into a distribution agreement pursuant to RCW 29.81A.020(1) and if the jurisdiction's legislative authority has chosen to participate.
- D. Election for incorporation or annexation to be conducted by mail ballot.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 8113, Section 2 and K.C.C. 1.10.020 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

Notification. Prior to any primary, general, or special

1 election for which a voter's pamphlet is being prepared, the King 2 County records and elections division shall notify each city, 3 town, and special taxing district located wholly within King County that a local voter's pamphlet will be published and 4 distributed; except, in the event the pamphlet is authorized 5 6 specifically because the election is by mail ballot, notice should 7 be sent to those cities and special taxing districts affected by 8 the proposed annexation and incorporation. 9 SECTION 3 The county council finds as a fact and declares 10 that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary for 11 the immediate preservation of public peace, health or safety or .12 for the support of county government and its existing public 13 institutions.
