ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE relating to the interim use of the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) fund for economic development projects and authorizing the King County executive to enter into loan agreements to effect the projects, and repealing Ordinance 8059 in its entirety.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 8059, Sections 1 through 5 are each repealed.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 2. Definitions. Unless the context otherwise requires, the terms defined in this section shall, for all purposes of this ordinance and of any ordinance supplemental hereto, have the meanings specific; words importing the singular number include the plural number and vice versa:

"County" means King County, Washington.

"Council" means the county council of King County, Washington.

"Community Development Interim Loan (CDIL)" shall mean the making of short-term financing loans to assist in the development of Community Development Block Grant eligible economic development projects.

"Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds" shall be those entitlement monies King County receives through the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development and are dedicated to the CDBG fund.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 3. It is found and determined that it is in the best interests of the county to make a CDIL in the amount of two million two hundred thousand dollars to the Robert S. and Marjorie E. Wilcoxon Trust. The loan will be used for the development of Woodinville West, an economic development project which will create jobs with primary benefit to lower income persons and enhance the CDBG fund by earning interest for economic development and other CDBG eligible activities.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 4. It is further found and determined that it is in the best interests of the county to make a CDIL in the amount of four hundred fifty thousand dollars to Pacific Coast Coal Company (PCCC). The loan will be used to finance the general operations of PCCC including the mining, processing and shipping of coal. The CDIL shall constitute an economic development project which will retain jobs which are primarily held by lower income persons and shall enhance the CDBG fund by earning interest for economic development and other CDBG eligible activities.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 5. In accordance with regulations of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, the King County executive is hereby authorized to extend CDILs to the Robert S. and Marjorie E. Wilcoxon Trust and to the Pacific Coast Coal Company, such unexpended balances as may become available in the King County CDBG Letter of Credit on deposit with the United States Department of the Treasury for use in economic development projects. The loans shall be repaid to King County in accordance with the terms and conditions of the agreements between the Robert S. and Marjorie E. Wilcoxon Trust and King County, and between Pacific Coast Coal Company and King County. The King County executive is hereby authorized to execute the referenced agreements on behalf of the county.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 6. For the purpose of making these CDILs, the sum of two million six hundred fifty thousand dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary to fund these two economic development projects shall be disbursed from the King County CDBG Letter of Credit on deposit with the United States Department of the Treasury.
