ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE calling for separate elections to be held to nominate and elect persons to fill the various elective offices prescribed by law for the City of Federal Way, which will be a noncharter code city, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. On March 14, 1989, a special election was held pursuant to King County Ordinance No. 8820 on the question of whether the area known as Federal Way should be incorporated as a noncharter code city.

SECTION 2. On March 24, 1989, the King County canvassing board certified the results of the March 14 special election on the question of incorporation, certifying that the proposed incorporation of the area known as Federal Way had been approved.

SECTION 3. Pursuant to RCW 35.02.079, the county council hereby calls for the manager of the division of records and elections to hold separate elections to nominate and elect persons to fill the various elective offices prescribed by law for the City of Federal Way, based on its population and the fact that Federal Way will be a noncharter code city.

SECTION 4. The primary election to nominate candidates for these elective positions shall be held at a special election occurring on Tuesday, May 16, 1989, as required by RCW 29.12.020.

SECTION 5. Following the primary election on May 16, the manager of records and elections shall conduct an election to fill these elective positions at the next special election date, as specified in RCW 29.13.020, that occurs 30 or more days after certification of the results of the primary election.

SECTION 6. Both elections shall be conducted by the manager of records and elections in accordance with all applicable laws and ordinances, including those related to the filing and withdrawal of declarations of candidacy.


SECTION 7. Pursuant to RCW Chapters 29.13 and 35.02, the council deems an emergency to exist for the purposes of calling for the elections referenced above.

SECTION 8. The county council finds as a fact and declares that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health or safety or for the support of county government and its existing public institutions.


