ORDINANCE NO. 8903

AN ORDINANCE relating to zoning; revising the permitted use provisions of the Forest-Recreation (F-R) zone classification; and amending Resolution 25789, Section 1901, as amended; and K.C.C. 21.38.020.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Resolution 25789, Section 1901, as amended, and K.C.C. 21.38.020 are each hereby amended to read as follows:

Permitted uses. In an F-R zone, the following uses only are permitted and as hereinafter specifically provided and allowed by this chapter:

- A. The growing and harvesting of forest products, <u>primary</u> <u>process of forest products including</u> the operation of sawmills and chippers, and activities and structures incidental to each, <u>such as log storage</u>;
- B. Log storage yards not associated with a primary processing activity, provided that a perimeter native vegetation buffer of 50 feet shall be established and maintained on the site;
- ((B.) \underline{C} . Livestock grazing and agricultural buildings and structures incidental thereto, and beehives, as provided in Section 21.22.020;
 - ((G.) D. Unclassified uses as provided in Chapter 21.44;
 - ((D.) E. Game and fish management;
- $((E_{\tau}) \ \underline{F}.$ Dams, power plants, flowage areas, transmission lines and stations, together with necessary accessory building;
- $((F_{-}) G_{-})$ Harvesting of any wild crop such as marsh hay, ferns, moss and berries;
- $((G_{\tau}) \ \underline{H.}$ Single-family residence, trailer, private summer cottages and incidental service buildings; provided, that multiple-lot subdivisions of more than four lots shall require a planned unit development to assure environmental protection;
 - ((H_{τ}) I. Riding academies;

Dear Councilmember Sims:

I am returning Ordinance No. 8903 without my signature and allowing it to become enacted notwithstanding my concern that it will create unnecessary difficulties for our forest industry. It is my belief that these difficulties were not intended by the ordinance sponsors or the other members of the Council or staff.

Specifically, the substitute ordinance passed by the Council resulted in the following:

- 1. The version passed by the Council attempted to eliminate a proposed new requirement for conditional use permits on sawmills and other timber processing activities which go beyond the zoning code's fairly narrowly defined "primary processing" permitted use. Instead, the substitute ordinance eliminates such activities from the zone altogether. This change will make "nonconforming uses" of most major sawmills in King County.
- 2. This legislation was originally proposed to accommodate a request for an independent log storage activity together with incidental equipment repair and company offices on FR-zoned land. Currently, the zoning code provides for such uses only in conjunction with sawmills on the same site. The substitute ordinance has only provided for the log storage element of this use. Without the opportunity to maintain equipment used in log storage or to provide for a company office, the code amendment does not provide a realistic or reasonable forestry-related activity.

I have asked James Tracy, Acting Director of Parks, Planning and Resources, to assign staff from the Building and Land Development Division's Code Development Group to work with the Councilmembers and staff to develop new legislation to address these problems.
