STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of a portion of Sweeney Road, herein after described.
- 2. The department of public works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements were granted to Puget Sound Power and Light Company and Pacific Northwest Bell Telephone Company.
- 3. The building and land development division has studied the proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 4. The vacation area is a segment of an old alignment of Sweeney Road. Sweeney Road was realigned at this location during the construction phase of Petrovitsky Road Extension. The vacation site was under continuous maintenance by King County prior to the realignment.
- 5. The department of public works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the county road system and believes the public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls. In accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759, the vacation area is classified "Class B". King County is in receipt of a check in the amount of \$1,915 from the petitioners. This amount was determined by multiplying the area by the assessed value per square foot of the adjoining land. Because of encumbrances on the property by the utility companies, the value of the property was reduced by 40%. The computation was set forth as follows:

Tax Lot 158 at \$0.24 Sq. Ft., x 6,300 Sq. Ft., = \$1,512Tax Lot 106 at \$0.20 Sq. Ft., x 8,400 Sq. Ft., = \$1,680

TOTAL $$3,192 ($3,192 \times 60\% = $1,915)$
