ORDINANCE NO. 9024

AN ORDINANCE creating a Commission for
Marketing Recyclable Materials.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. A. Created. There is established a Commission
for Marketing Recyclable Materials, hereinafter called the
Commission.

B. Purpose. The purpose of the Commission is to establish,
enhance and assure utilization of methods for reusing materials
which would otherwise be disposed, and in particular to promote
use of products manufactured from recycled materials. The
Commission shall also recommend policy to King County and other
jurisdictions within the county as needed to enhance the
development of markets for use of recycled and recyclable
materials. The Commission shall emphasize development of local
markets.

C. Composition and Membership. The Commission shall be
composed of 21 members who shall be nominated by the Council,
appointed by the Executive and confirmed by the King County
council. The members shall include representatives of the solid
waste collection companies certificated by the Washington
Utilities and Transportation Commission, the recycling industry,
manufacturers located in King County, chambers of commerce, trade
and economic development councils, the City of Seattle, the Port
of Seattle, institutions of higher education located in King
County, citizen groups with an interest in recycling, at least
one King County Councilmember, and at least one representative
appointed by the President of the Suburban Cities Association.

1 D. Terms. Appointments to the Commission shall be for
2 three-year terms beginning on July 1 of the year in which the
3 term starts; except that the terms for the initial appointments
4 to the Commission shall be established by lot, five appointments
5 for one year each, five appointments for two years each, and five
6 appointments for three years. If a vacancy occurs, a successor
7 may be appointed in the same manner as for full terms to serve
8 for the remainder of the unexpired term and that appointment
9 shall be subject to reappointment for a full term upon expiration
10 of the original term.

11 SECTION 2. Procedures.

12 A. A simple majority of the total number of members shall
13 constitute a quorum. All official actions of the Commission
14 shall require a simple majority vote of the quorum, unless a
15 greater plurality is specified in rules adopted by the Commission.

16 B. The Commission may adopt operating rules. Unless
17 otherwise specified in this ordinance or in rules adopted by the
18 Commission, Robert's Rules of Order shall apply.

19 C. The Commission shall meet at least monthly.

20 D. The Commission shall elect officers, who shall include
21 but not be limited to a chair, vice-chair, and secretary.

22 E. The Commission shall keep minutes of its regular public
23 meetings and records of all official actions.

24 F. All records of the Commission shall be available for
25 public inspection pursuant to RCW 42.17 at the office of the
26 Commission.

27 G. The Commission may establish committees from time to time
28 and shall specify at the time of establishment the function and
29 powers of the committees.

1 SECTION 3. A. Executive Director. The executive director
2 of the Commission shall be appointed by the director of the
3 department of public works with the advice of the Commission.
4 The executive director shall be an administrative assistant to
5 the Commission. The performance of the executive director shall
6 be evaluated annually by the director of the department of public
7 works and by the Commission. The executive director shall be
8 responsible for management and administration of the Commission.

9 B. Budget. The Commission shall submit an annual budget
10 request to the King County Executive and council in accordance
11 with the established county budget procedures. All staff
12 positions beyond the executive director must be approved by the
13 King County council through the county budget adoption process
14 and shall be subject to county career service rules.

15 C. Leases and Contracts. The Commission may from time to
16 time enter into any contract or lease with any agency or
17 individual that the Commission deems appropriate for the purpose
18 of carrying out its responsibilities under this ordinance,
19 provided that any lease or contract shall be subject to all
20 applicable provisions and procedures of federal, state and county
21 law.

22 SECTION 4. A. Funding. Funding for activities of the
23 Commission shall be established by the council after it receives
24 the first report from the Commission as directed in Section 5 of
25 this ordinance.


26 B. Grants and Private Funding. The Commission is authorized
27 to seek grants and private funding to support programs of the
28 Commission.

1 SECTION 5. Annual Report. The Commission shall prepare
2 annually, for publication in July of each year and transmittal
3 the executive, county and public, a report of its budget,
4 activities for the preceding calendar year and goals, policy
5 recommendations and financial plans for the following five year
6 period; except that the first report of the Commission shall be
7 submitted by November 1, 1989, and shall include a proposed 1990
8 budget and work plan.




