ordinance no. 9134

AN ORDINANCE relating to 1% for Art; repealing Ordinance No. 6111 and K.C.C. 4.40.010 through 4.40.090; creating a new fund for 1% for Art, pooling existing monies in 1% for Art projects; and expanding the scope of uses for 1% for Art monies.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 6111 and K.C.C. 4.40.010 through 4.40.090 are each repealed.

SECTION 2. There is hereby established a "1% for Art Fund."

SECTION 3. Purpose. It is the intention of King County to provide opportunities for the public to experience and participate in the cultural and artistic legacy of this region. The council is also committed to enhancing the environment by involving artists, where possible, in the design of King County facilities. A policy is therefore established to direct the pooling of 1% for Art monies to be used to include works of art in certain public places and to expand the access to, and the cultural and ethnic diversity of, the art experienced in public places by citizens of King County.

SECTION 4. Definitions. A. "Arts Commission" means the King County Arts Commission.

- B. "County Construction project" means any project paid for by funds appropriated by King County, to construct or remodel any building, decorative or commemorative structure, park, or any portion thereof, within the jurisdiction of King County except projects excluded in Section 5 of this ordinance.
- C. "Demolition costs" shall mean payments for any work required for the removal of buildings or other existing structures from the property.

D. "Equipment costs" shall mean payments for any equipment or furnishings that are portable and of standard manufacture. Equipment shall not mean items that are custom designed or that create a new use for the facility, whether portable or affixed.

E. "Real Property acquisition costs" shall mean payments made for the purchase of parcels of land, existing buildings, and structures, and costs incurred by the county for the appraisals or negotiations in connection with such purchase.

SECTION 5. Appropriations. All future appropriations for county construction projects shall include an amount to be set aside for transfer to the 1% for Art Fund, except for appropriations for roads, bridges, sewers, surface water projects, solid waste landfills, and maintenance projects, and except for supplemental appropriations to correct actual or anticipated project overruns not involving a change in project scope. The transfer appropriations from the various projects shall be pooled in the 1% for Art Fund.

 $\underline{\sf SECTION~6}$. Uses. The appropriations pooled into the 1% for Art Fund are to be used for:

- l. the selection, acquisition, and display of works of visual art, which may be:
 - a. an integral part of the project,
- b. placed in, on or about the project or other public facility, or
- c. worked into the design of the project or public facility with agreement of the executive or his or her designate;

- 3. repairs and maintenance of 1% for Art artworks by county departments;
- 4. participation by citizens, including community groups and children, working with professional artists in the creation of works of art in public places;
- 5. introducing public art to children and adults by applying a portion of 1% for Art project budgets toward project-specific education, such as exhibits and artist presentations to school and community groups;
- 6. other pilot projects as recommended by the Arts Commission which may involve other artistic disciplines in a diversity of cultures and ethnic backgrounds.

SECTION 7. Multi-Cultural Art. King County is committed to participation by multi-cultural and ethnic artists in public art. Therefore the Arts Commission is directed to make a conscious effort to better represent multi-cultural and ethnic artists by:

- l. ensuring that juries and commissioned artists reflect the ethnic diversity of the population of King County, and,
- 2. supporting and developing projects that create opportunities for multi-cultural and ethnic artists by increasing the number of commissions for the services of multi-cultural and ethnic artists, and placing a high priority on acquiring art work by multi-cultural and ethnic artists. The Arts Commission is directed to prepare a plan to comply with these objectives, which shall be submitted to the council for review and approval no later than January 1990.

 identifies and describes projects to be accomplished during the coming budget year from the 1% for Art Fund. It is recognized that the accuracy of this plan is contingent upon the availability and interdepartmental evaluation of the Capital Improvement Program request and therefore may require update and amendment by the councy council upon its review. The annual 1% for Art Projects Plan may include a special projects category to allow for flexibility and responsiveness. This plan shall be approved by the council as the basis for the 1% for Art Fund appropriation.

SECTION 9. Method of calculation. The minimum amount to be appropriated for art shall be the total county-funded portion of the appropriation divided by 100, except that any county-funded amount intended to be used for real property acquisition, demolition, or equipment costs shall be excluded from the total for purposes of this calculation. If project funds are appropriated wholly or in part from a grant to the county, and if the granting authority has approved use of a portion of the grant amount for art, then this amount shall be appropriated in addition to any amount appropriated from county funding sources.

SECTION 10. "Transfer to 1% for Art Fund" projects. The funds appropriated pursuant to this ordinance shall be appropriated for transfer to the 1% for Art fund. Upon the effective date of such appropriations funds shall be transferred by the county executive or his representative to the project designated as the "Transfer to 1% for Art Fund" and shall then be automatically transferred to the 1% for Art

SECTION 11. A. Project Funds. The following capital projects, entitled "Transfer to 1% for Art Fund" projects, are hereby established for the purpose of transfering appropriations to the 1% for Art Fund:

B. Whenever a new capital fund shall be created, a new "Transfer to 1% for Art Fund" project shall be created within that capital fund to receive art monies for transfer to the 1% for Art Fund provided the fund's capital projects fall within the requirements of this ordinance.

SECTION 12. General Obligation Bond proceeds. In the case I

capital purposes consistent with the resolution(s) or ordinance(s) approved by the voters or the county council. Bond funds shall be accounted for separately within the 1% for Art Fund if necessary to comply with these requirements.

SECTION 13. Harborview Medical Center capital reserves.

SECTION 13. Harborview Medical Center capital reserves.

For any 1% for Art funds which involve the use of Harborview Medical Center's capital reserves (Fund 396), amounts for works of art described in this ordinance shall be used for art projects at Harborview Medical Center. These funds may be accounted for separately within the 1% for Art Fund if necessary to comply with this requirement.

SECTION 14. Arts Commission responsibilities. A. The Arts Commission shall be responsible for advising the county executive and the county council in the administration of the 1% for Art Fund, including preparation and recommendation of an annual 1% for Art Projects Plan, establishing program guidelines, designating sites, determining budgets, establishing juries, selecting and commissioning of artists, reviewing the design. execution and placement of works of art funded by this ordinance, and for the removal of works from the county collection.

B. The Arts Commission shall notify the department manager responsible for operation and maintenance of any proposed work of art requiring extraordinary operation or maintenance expenses prior to the artwork's fabrication, and shall obtain the concurrence of the department manager or the county executive where issues of extraordinary operation or maintenance costs are unresolved. All repairs and maintenance of artworks by county
