AN ORDINANCE granting the appeal of the report and recommendation of the Zoning and Subdivision Examiner, amending King County Zoning Resolution No. 25789, as amended, by reclassifying certain property upon the application of CASHMERE MANOR, INC. and ROBERT VERZANI, designated Building and Land Development File No. 208-87-R.

SECTION 1: This ordinance adopts and incorporates Findings Nos. 1 through 16 of the December 29, 1988 Report of the Zoning and Subdivision Examiner, filed with the Clerk of the Council on January 12, 1989, and the July 19, 1989 Supplemental Findings of the Zoning and Subdivision Examiner, filed with the Clerk of the Council on August 3, 1989, on the application of Cashmere Manor, Inc. and Robert J. Verzani, to reclassify certain property described in Building and Land Development Division File No. 208-87-R.

SECTION 2. The Council further finds that the 1981 enactment of Ordinance No. 5138 (King County Code Chapter 21.20A), which established the RMHP zone classification, is a change in conditions and circumstances which affects the subject property in a manner and to a degree different than other properties in the vicinity; that this change in conditions and circumstances was not anticipated or contemplated in the Community Plan or Area Zoning encompassing this property; that the requested reclassification of the subject property from SR to RMHP will provide additional spaces which are needed for mobile homes in the area; and that availability of mobile home spaces provides an alternative housing opportunity for persons of moderate income, which is required in the public interest.

SECTION 3. The Council concludes that since conditions and circumstances affecting the subject property have undergone substantial and

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material change not anticipated or contemplated in the Community Plan or Area Zoning, and since the impacts from those changed conditions and circumstances affect the subject property in a manner and to a degree different than other properties in the vicinity, and since the requested reclassification is required in the public interest, that the proposed reclassification meets the requirements of KCC 20.24.190, and would carry out and help to implement the goals and objectives of the King County Comprehensive Plan, the Zoning Code and other policies and objectives for the growth of King County. The requested use will not be unreasonably incompatible with, or detrimental to, affected properties and the general public.

SECTION 4. The subject property is hereby reclassified by the Council of King County to RMHP, subject to the following post-effective conditions:

- The preparation, approval and implementation of surface water drainage plans which shall provide for detention of not less than the 100-year storm event, with the peak allowable discharge not to exceed a pre-development 2-year storm. All storm water detention facilities shall be located outside of the 25-year floodplain. Drainage plans shall be approved by the King County Surface Water Management Division, which shall solicit the comments of the State of Washington Departments of Game and Fisheries prior to approval. The foregoing plan review and approval shall be accomplished, and temporary erosion and sedimentation controls constructed, prior to making any improvements on the property.
- 2. An internal circulation and access plan shall be implemented

which provides a full-width road, aligned with 34th Avenue South or offset not less than 300 feet from the existing 34th Avenue South. SECTION 5. The Building and Land Development Division shall amend the official zoning maps of King County to reflect this action.
