ORDINANCE NO.

9241

AN ORDINANCE establishing the date of an election on the question of annexation to the City of Des Moines, adoption of proposed zoning, assumption of indebtedness, and formation of a community municipal corporation and election of its first members, within an area contiguous to the City known as the Northwest Des Moines Annexation Area, requesting it be held by mail and declaring an emergency.

STATEMENT OF FACT:

- The City of Des Moines, Washington, by Resolution No. 576 has determined that it is in the public interest, health, safety and general welfare to provide for annexation of an area known as Northwest Des Moines in accordance with chapter 35A.14, RCW.
- 2. Said resolution does satisfy the provisions of RCW 35A.14.010 for qualification for annexation.
- The City of Des Moines, by Resolution No. 576 adopted July 29, 1989, concurs in the annexation of the area known as Northwest Des Moines as provided by RCW 35A.14.050.
- 4. Pursuant to the provisions of RCW 36.93.100, the Boundary Review Board (BRB) invoked jurisdiction and in accordance with RCW 36.39.160 on November 9, 1989, filed its written decision approving the proposed annexation as submitted.
- 5. Pursuant to RCW Chapters 29.13 and 35A.14, the council deems an emergency exists for purpose of calling a special election.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. A special election shall be held on the 6th day of February, 1990, in accordance with RCW 35A.14.050 to be held within the territory of the proposed annexation, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters within said territory the questions of annexation, zoning, assumption of

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indebtedness, and the formation of a community municipal corporation.

SECTION 2. The number of registered voters within the subject areas is estimated at 3,325 as nearly as may be determined from available records, and has been certified as such.

SECTION 3. The ballot title, as directed by statute, should be substantially as follows:

PROPOSITION:

A. Shall the area of King County commonly known as Northwest Des Moines and described in this ordinance and in Resolution No. 576 of the City of Des Moines be annexed to the City of Des Moines and be subject to proposed zoning and land use regulations as provided in Resolution No. 576, with all property within the area upon annexation being assessed and taxed at the same rate as property within the City to pay for all or any portion of legally incurred indebtedness of the City and with the formation of a community municipal corporation for a portion of the area as described in Resolution No. 576, and Resolution No. 581?

FOR ANNEXATION TO THE CITY OF DES MOINES, ASSUMPTION OF A PRO-RATED PORTION OF EXISTING INDEBTEDNESS, ADOPTION OF PROPOSED ZONING AND LAND USE REGULATIONS AND FORMATION OF A COMMUNITY MUNICIPAL CORPORATION

AGAINST ANNEXATION

4. It is further requested to conduct at the same general election, and pursuant to RCW 35.14.020, the election of the initial five (5) members of the Northwest Des Moines Community Land Use Council community municipal corporation members, within that portion of the annexation area legally described in Exhibit "B". The five positions shall be identified as Positions 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5, and filings shall be by position. A special filing period shall be established as prescribed by the Records and Elections Division.

SECTION 5. The boundaries of the territory proposed for annexation are hereby described as follows:

BEGINNING at the intersection of the East margin of 24th Ave.
South with the centerline of South 216th Street, said point being within the Northeast 1/4, Section 9, Township 22 North, Range 4

Thence Westerly along said centerline to its intersection with the projection of the East line of the West 806.50 feet of the Southeast 1/4 of the Northeast 1/4 of Section 8, Township 22 North, Range 4 East, W.M.;

Thence Northerly along said East line to the North line of the South 1/2 of the Northeast 1/4 of said Section 8;

Thence Southerly along said West line to its intersection with the centerline of South 216th Street;

Thence Northerly and Westerly along said South margin to a point 5 feet East of the Northwest corner of Block 4, the Town of Des Moines, Plat as recorded in Volume 3, page 165, Records of King County, WA. (Des Moines Ordinance No. 774);

Thence continuing Westerly, Southwesterly, and Northwesterly along said South margin of South 216th Street and the South margin of South 216th Place, also being the Normandy Park City limits to the intersection of the South margin of South 216th Street and the South margin of South 216th Place;

Thence Easterly along said South margin of South 216th Street to the projection of the East margin of First Avenue South, known also as Puget Sound Marine View Drive;

Thence Northerly along said projection and East margin to the North margin of South 192nd Street.

Thence Easterly along said North margin to the Westerly margin of SR-509 right-of-way as located in the Southeast 1/4 Section 32, Township 23 North, Range 4 East, W.M.;

Thence Southeasterly, Southerly, and Easterly along said Westerly margin of SR-509 right-of-way to the intersection with the Western margin of Des Moines Memorial Drive South (Des Moines Way South);

Thence Southerly along said west margin to the North margin of South 208th Street, also the City limits of SeaTac;

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Thence Easterly along said North margin to the East line of the Plat of Grove Addition to Des Moines as recorded in Volume $4\,$ of Plats page 83;

Thence South along said East line 100 feet more or less to the North margin of South 208th Street extended;

Thence East along said North margin to the East margin of 24th Avenue South;

Thence Southerly along the boundary of the City limits of the City of SeaTac, as described in King County Ordinance No. 8820 to the South line of the Northwest 1/4 of the Northeast 1/4 of Section 9, Township 22 North, Range 4 East;

Thence Northerly and Westerly along said South margin to a point 5 feet East of the Northwest corner of Block 4, the Town of Des Moines, Plat as recorded in Volume 3, page 165 Records of King County, WA. (Des Moines Ordinance No. 774).

Thence continuing Westerly, Southwesterly, and Northwesterly along said South margin of South 216th Street and the South margin of South 216th Place, also being the Normandy Park City limits to the intersection of the South margin of South 216th Street and the South margin of South 216th Place;

Thence Easterly along said South margin of South 216th Street to the projection of the East margin of 1st Avenue South, known also as Puget Sound Marine View drive;

Thence Northerly along said projection and East margin to the North margin of South 192nd Street;

Thence Easterly along said North margin to the Westerly margin of SR-509 right-of-way as located in the Southeast 1/4 Section 32, Township 23 North, Range 4 East, W.M.;

Thence Southeasterly, Southerly, and Easterly along said Westerly margin of SR-509 right-of-way to the intersection with the Western margin of Des Moines Memorial Drive South (Des Moines Way South);

Thence Southerly along said West margin to the North margin of south 208th Street, also the City limits of SeaTac;

Thence Easterly along said North margin to the East line of the Plat of Grove Addition to Des Moines as recorded in Volume 4 of Plats page 83;

Thence South along said East line 100 feet more or less to the North margin of South 208th Street extended;

Thence East along said North margin to the North extension of the West line of Mayvale No. 3 Addition as recorded in 78 page 55 Records of King County, WA.;

Thence Southerly along said West line to the South line of the North 1/2 of the Northwest 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 9, Township 22 North, Range 4 East;

Thence Easterly along said South line to the East line of the Northwest 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 9, Township 22 North, Range 4 East;

Thence Southerly along said East line to the South line of the Northwest 1/4 of the Northwest 1/4 of Section 9, Township 22 North, Range 4 East;

Thence Westerly along said South line and its projection to the West margin of SR-509 right-of-way;

Thence Northerly along said West margin to the North margin of South 212th Street;

Thence Westerly along said North margin to the West line of Section 9, Township 22 North, Range 4 East, W.M.;

Thence Southerly along said west line to its intersection with the centerline of South 216th Street and the Point of Beginning of this description.

<u>SECTION 6.</u> The notice of election shall be published as required by law.

SECTION 7. The county council finds as a fact and declares that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace, health or safety or for the support of county government and its existing public institutions.

Re: Ordinance No. 9241 Des Moines Annexation Election

Dear Councilmember Sims:

I am transmitting the enclosed ordinance to you without my signature. As you know, the County Council passed Ordinance No. 9241, authorizing placement of the Des Moines annexation question on the February 6, 1990 ballot as a vote-by-mail issue. However, on that same date Highline School District No. 401 is scheduled to have school levy measure placed on the ballot as a poll election.

It is general practice <u>not</u> to conduct poll elections and vote-by-mail elections in the same precincts, at the same time because they result in considerable voter confusion and present significant and unresolvable election administration problems which could negatively impact the conduct of the elections.

By statue, the Highline School District's request for a polling election takes precedence over the vote-by-mail request. Therefore, the County Auditor (Records and Elections Manager) has the authority to determine that the Des Moines Annexation may not be conducted as a vote-by-mail.

The Records and Election Manager and Councilmember Barden met with the Highline School District Superintendent and the City Manager for Des Moines. The Des Moines City Council also met and agreed that a poll election would be satisfactory. As a result of these meetings, and a review by the Prosecuting Attorney's Office, it was determined that both elections will be conducted by poll. The County Auditors determination was transmitted to the Des Moines City Manager on Thursday, December 21, 1989.
