PREAMBLE:

Under provision of Section 220.20 of the Home Rule Charter, "the county council shall...have the power to establish, abolish, combine, and divide administrative offices and executive departments..." The department of human resources was formed with the passage of Ordinance 6066 effective January 1, 1983. Since that time there have been significant program changes which warrant a reorganization of the department of human resources.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 6066, Section 22, as amended, and K.C.C. 2.16.130 are hereby repealed.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 2. There is added to Ordinance 6066 and K.C.C. 2.16 a new section to read as follows:

DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES. The department of human services is responsible to manage and be fiscally accountable for the community services division, mental health division, public defense division, and the office of aging, developmental disabilities, and fiscal management.

- A. COMMUNITY SERVICES DIVISION. The function of the division is to assist individuals and families to improve the quality of their lives by promoting self-sufficiency and opportunity as well as prevention of problems which lead to individual and family dysfunction. The programs the division is responsible to manage include, but are not limited to:
 - 1. Contracted Youth Services
- Employment Programs consisting of Veterans' and Work Training
 Programs.
 - 3. Women's Program
 - 4. Cooperative Extension Service
 - 5. Child Care Program

disturbed, seriously disturbed, and chronically mentally ill children and adults.

- 2. Manage and operate a 24-hour crisis response system, including civil commitment as a last resort.
- 3. Select appropriate community agencies for the provision of mental health services and develop, implement, and monitor contracts with selected agencies.
- 4. Be responsible for resource management of a comprehensive mental health system including provision of staff support to appropriate advisory boards, and serve as liaison to federal, state, and other governments and relevant organizations in carrying out planning and allocation processes.
- C. PUBLIC DEFENSE DIVISION. The functions of the division shall include those functions specified in K.C.C. 2.60.
- D. OFFICE OF AGING, DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, AND FISCAL MANAGEMENT.

 The functions of this office shall include the responsibility to:
- 1. Provide services to seniors in accordance with county policies and procedures.
- 2. Manage and operate a system of services for persons with developmental disabilities in accordance with relevant state statutes and county policies, and provide staff support to relevant advisory boards.
- 3. Negotiate, implement, and monitor contracts with community agencies for the provision of developmental disabilities and aging program services.
- 4. Ensure accountability, efficiency, and consistency through central fiscal and payroll functions; to negotiate and monitor special contracts; and to provide analytic support to divisions and department.
