 ordinance no. 9279

AN ORDINANCE pertaining to the use of the Hotel-Motel Tax revenues; creating the King County Arts and Cultural Education Program and the King County Arts and Cultural Education Program Fund; and creating the King County Arts and Cultural Development Fund, the King County Arts and Cultural Tourism and Enrichment Program and the King County Opportunity Grant Program.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS: The Washington State Legislature has decided under the provisions of RCW 67.28.180(3)(a) that excess proceeds from the hotel-motel tax levied annually in King County shall only be used for the support of the arts, the performing arts, art museums, and cultural museums of King County.

- A. King County's diverse arts and heritage organizations and professional artists can enrich and support arts and cultural education and arts and cultural tourism in this region. King County is a regional and national center for arts and culture and has the seventh largest population of individual artists per capita nationwide. These arts and cultural resources can train young artists, build audiences for the future and attract local residents, children and tourists to their events and programs.
- B. Arts and cultural education in the public schools is an integral part of support for the arts and culture. It provides the opportunity to observe, participate and engage in the arts and cultural process with professional artists and community arts and cultural organizations, as a part of the educational process in and out of the classroom.
  - C. While the state of Washington, through the Basic Education

Act, is responsible for funding arts and cultural education as part of basic education, King County and its citizens have a compelling and continuing interest in the education of young people, including education in the public schools in the arts and culture, and may choose to enhance basic education through grants and other means as deemed necessary to implement the enhancement.

D. Involving children in creating works of art and providing the opportunities for children to work with arts teachers, artists, and performing arts organizations, both in the classroom and in the community, is necessary as part of a comprehensive arts and cultural education program. Education in arts and culture can increase students' awareness, knowledge, and acceptance of arts and culture; can improve understanding between artists, teachers and administrators; and can encourage cooperation among arts, heritage, and educational institutions and organizations.

SECTION 2. Definitions. A. "Arts and culture" is defined as the arts and cultural disciplines, which include but are not limited to dance, drama/theatre, music, visual arts, literary arts, media arts, performing arts, traditional and folk arts, ethnic arts, and history, heritage and historic preservation.

- "Arts and cultural education" is defined as the sequential and comprehensive study of the elements of the various art and cultural forms and how to use them creatively including instruction in skills, critical assessment, the history of the art and cultural forms, and aesthetic judgment.
- "Arts and cultural tourism and enrichment" is defined as arts and cultural institutions, individuals and programs working together with the tourism industry to enhance the county's international reputation by promoting its cultural and artistic

attractions and broadening the audiences served. Arts and cultural tourism and enrichment preserves the county's artistic and cultural identity, strengthens the local economy and improves the quality of life for county residents.

 $\underline{\text{SECTION 3.}}$  There is hereby created the King County Arts and Cultural Education Program Fund.

- A. The King County Arts and Cultural Education Program Fund shall be a special revenue fund.
- B. For investment purposes, the King County Arts and Cultural Education Program Fund shall be considered a second tier fund with the finance section of the office of financial management designated as fund manager.
- C. Beginning January 1, 1991, forty percent of all excess hotel-motel tax revenues collected by King County under the provisions of RCW 67.28.180(3)(a) in any calendar year shall be deposited in the King County Arts and Cultural Education Program Fund.
- D. Monies expended from the King County Arts and Cultural Education Program Fund shall be used only for the King County Arts and Cultural Education Program and shall be subject to the conditions as defined in this ordinance.
- E. First distribution of funds shall be no later than the 1991-1992 school year. Subsequent distributions shall occur annually for each school year, thereafter.

SECTION 4. The King County Council hereby establishes the King County Arts and Cultural Education Program. The program shall consist of one- to three-year grants for King County public school- and/or public school district-initiated projects and programs, reviewed annually, and shall be subject to the following:

- A. Applicants eligible to apply for the King County Arts and Cultural Education Program grants are all King County public schools and/or public school districts in King County that meet the applicable deadlines for the King County Arts and Cultural Education Program.
- B. Local control of King County's public schools shall be preserved.
- C. Monies granted to the individual King County public schools and/or public school districts shall be used to enrich existing arts and cultural education programs or to create new ones and in any event shall be expended only for direct costs for arts and cultural education as defined in this ordinance, which may include fees for artists, arts specialists, experts in arts education, and performing arts organizations.
- D. All grades shall be eligible for funding through grants under this ordinance. However, while funds are minimal, grades K-8, or grades K-9 in schools where grade 9 remains in the middle school configuration, shall receive priority for funding.
- E. The cost of administering the King County Arts and Cultural Education Program shall be minimal.
- F. Individual schools shall apply for the grants by February 15th in order to be awarded allocations starting July 1 of the same year.
- G. Applications must describe the intended use of the grant funds. The intended use must be for King County school- and/or public school district-initiated projects and programs for arts and cultural education as defined in this ordinance. Grant applications may address the needs of special student populations, such as at-risk students and students with handicaps or disabilities, and other youth of school age who are not currently in school, such as youth in detention and those who have dropped out of school.

- H. There shall be written guidelines and procedures for applying for grants which shall include eligibility criteria, scope of program, and funding needs. The guidelines shall be written by the Arts and Cultural Education Advisory Committee and recommended by the Arts Commission and shall be subject to council approval. The advisory committee shall establish procedures for evaluation of programs and accountability of funds. These procedures shall be submitted by the Arts Commission to the council for approval.
- I. Grant awards shall reflect a county-wide geographic distribution, and shall include public schools and public school districts from various affluent and less affluent communities.
- J. Grant decisions are made on a competitive basis and in accordance with criteria established pursuant to paragraph H. above. Established criteria shall include commitment and ability to provide student learning in arts and culture. Grants made under the King County Arts and Cultural Education Program shall recognize that Bellevue is receiving its own hotel-motel tax revenues, and therefore preference shall be given to applications serving other areas of the county. Grants to Bellevue public schools for worthwhile projects are not precluded. King County Arts and Cultural Education Program grant awards shall be allocated to individual schools by July 1 of each year.

SECTION 5. Responsibility. The King County Parks, Planning and Resources Department, Cultural Resources Division, shall be responsible for staff support for the Arts and Cultural Education Program in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

SECTION 6. There is hereby created the King County Arts and Cultural Education Advisory Committee as a subcommittee of the King County Arts Commission to oversee and provide direction for the King County Arts and Cultural Education Program and make recommendations through the Arts Commission to the King County Executive and King County Council.

- A. The Arts and Cultural Education Advisory Committee membership shall reflect the ethnic and geographic diversity of King County. The committee shall have nine members. The nine members shall include parents, an arts administrator, public school art teachers, public school teachers, professional artists, representatives of cultural, heritage and ethnic organizations, interested community volunteers and two King County Arts Commission members.
- B. The members of the Advisory Committee shall be nominated by the executive and confirmed by the council and shall serve for three-year terms. Three of the initial appointments shall be for three-year terms, three for two-year terms and three for a one-year term to enable terms to be staggered.
- C. The duties and authorities of the Advisory Committee shall be the following:
- 1. Develop guidelines and evaluation criteria to apply for and award grants under this program.
- 2. Review and determine eligibility of all grant applications.
  - 3. Submit budget recommendations for the program.
- 4. Recommend through the Arts Commission grant awards for approval by the King County Executive and King County Council.
- 5. Set forth program ideas and suggestions for schools to consider.
- 6. Encourage a high quality of programs and a diversity of program ideas.
- 7. Assure grant awards reflect a broad geographic distribution of schools and school districts, and are accessible to children from a wide range of socioeconomic levels, ethnic groups and special student populations.

- 8. Annually report program results through the Arts

  Commission to the King County Executive and King County Council.
  - 9. Evaluate grant performance and expenditures.
- 10. Make suggestions through the Arts Commission to the King County Executive and the King County Council for program improvements.
- <u>SECTION 7</u>. There is hereby created the King County Arts and Cultural Development Fund.
- A. The King County Arts and Cultural Development Fund shall be a special revenue fund.
- B. For investment purposes, the King County Arts and Cultural Development Fund shall be considered a second tier fund with the finance section of the office of financial management designated as fund manager.
- C. Beginning January 1, 1991, sixty percent of all excess hotel-motel tax revenues collected by King County under the provisions of RCW 67.28.180(3)(a), in any calendar year shall be deposited in the King County Arts and Cultural Development Fund. The King County Arts and Cultural Development Fund will fund the new King County Arts and Cultural Tourism and Enrichment Program and the new King County Opportunity Grant Program.
- D. Monies expended from this fund shall be used only for the purposes established in this ordinance and shall be subject to the conditions of this ordinance.
- SECTION 8. There is hereby established the King County Arts and Cultural Tourism and Enrichment Program. This program shall consist of competitive grants, reviewed annually, to arts and cultural/heritage organizations, individual artists, community educational organizations and community arts groups which reflect the multi-cultural, ethnic and geographic diversity of King County. Applications must describe the intended use of the grant

funds, and applicants may request full cost recovery. Consideration shall be given to the potential of each project for developing tourism related to arts and cultural/historic events and features in King County.

- A. There shall be written guidelines and procedures for applying for grants which shall include eligibility criteria, scope of program, and funding needs. The guidelines shall be written by the Cultural Resources Division and recommended by the executive, and shall be subject to council approval. The Cultural Resources Division, through the executive, shall submit for council review an annual report which evaluates the King County Arts and Cultural Tourism and Enrichment Program and accounts for fund expenditures.
- B. Two-thirds of the excess hotel-motel tax revenues allocated to the King County Arts and Cultural Development Fund shall be expended for the King County Arts and Cultural Tourism and Enrichment Program, provided that at least 20% of the King County Arts and Cultural Tourism and Enrichment Program revenue allocation shall be earmarked for heritage programs and administered by the King County Landmarks Commission.
- C. The funds expended for the King County Arts and Cultural Tourism and Enrichment Program shall be used to assure the financial stability and expand the role of local arts and cultural organizations and individuals as artistic and cultural educational resources which develop King County as a tourism attraction through arts and cultural/historic events and features in King County, within the intent and purposes authorized by RCW 67.28.180(3)(a). The purpose of these funds is to:
- 1. Enhance the ability of arts organizations and of individual artists to produce and present challenging high quality art works.

- 2. Enhance the exhibits and/or permanent collections that are the unique features of the museums and visual art centers.
- 3. Assist in providing and bringing touring programs and exhibits on the regional and national level to King County.
- 4. Improve audience development and arts and cultural opportunities for special populations, multi-cultural audiences and King County youth.
- 5. Provide assistance for planning and improvement of arts and cultural facilities.
- 6. Provide for preservation and restoration of cultural/historical facilities.
- 7. Encourage and provide an exchange of services and technical assistance between larger and smaller organizations, individual artists and heritage professionals.
- 8. Provide funds for arts and cultural/heritage organizations and museums to comply with Section 504 of the Federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended.
- D. Eligibility. Eligible applicants shall include but not be limited to individual artists, arts and cultural/heritage organizations, community arts and cultural groups, community educational organizations and family and youth programs relating to arts and culture which reflect the multi-cultural, ethnic and geographic diversity of King County.
- SECTION 9. The King County Arts and Cultural Tourism and Enrichment Program shall be a separate program under the direction of the Cultural Resources Division with input from both the King County Arts Commission and the King County Landmarks Commission.
- A. The duties and authorities of the Cultural Resources Division shall be the following:
- 1. Develop guidelines and eligibility criteria for the King County Arts and Cultural Tourism and Enrichment Program.

- Submit project proposals to the King County Arts Commission or the King County Landmarks Commission as applicable for review and eligibility determination of all project proposals.
- Submit project proposals for review and appropriation by the Council.
- Annually report program results to the King County 4. Executive and King County Council.
  - 5. Review, evaluate and account for expenditures of funds.
- B. The cost of administering the King County Arts and Cultural Tourism and Enrichment Program shall be minimal.
- SECTION 10. There is hereby established the King County Opportunity Grant Program.
- The Opportunity Grant Program shall be administered by the Cultural Resources Division under the direction of the King County Executive and in accordance with the guidelines and policies established by the King County Council. The Opportunity Grant Program shall consist of competitive grants, reviewed annually, for funding innovative endeavors relating to arts, culture/heritage and education which are not funded by existing programs. Projects may include individual or collaborative efforts, but the Cultural Resources Division shall give special consideration to applications which reflect collaboration between any of the art and culture disciplines, educational institutions and community arts and heritage groups. Grant awards are intended to fund smaller and diverse organizations and activities. Applications must describe the intended use of the grant funds.
- One-third of the excess hotel-motel tax revenues allocated to the King County Arts and Cultural Development Fund shall be expended for the King County Opportunity Grant Program, provided that at least 20% of the King County Opportunity Grant Program

- C. Eligibility. Eligible applicants shall include but not be limited to individual artists, arts and cultural/heritage organizations, community arts and cultural groups, public educational institutions, community educational organizations, and family and youth programs relating to arts and culture which reflect the multi-cultural, ethnic and geographic diversity of King County.
- D. There shall be written guidelines and procedures for applying for grants which shall include eligibility criteria, scope of program, and funding needs. The guidelines shall be written by the Cultural Resources Division and recommended by the executive to the Council for aproval. The Cultural Resources Division, through the executive, shall submit for council review an annual report which evaluates the King County Opportunity Grant Program and accounts for fund expenditures.
- E. Opportunity grants can include but are not limited to endeavors that:
- 1. Promote the cultural diversity and arts activity of this region as well as promote its multi-cultural history and heritage.
- 2. Address the special needs of mid-sized and smaller organizations, including providing technical assistance.
- 3. Produce special events and programs such as festivals that will highlight the region's cultural resources.
- 4. Provide assistance for planning and improvement of arts and cultural facilities.
- 5. Provide for preservation and restoration of cultural/historical facilities.
- 6. Provide funds for arts and cultural/heritage organizations and museums to comply with Section 504 of the Federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended.

- F. Applications for funds shall be made to the Cultural Resources Division and will be reviewed and recommended for funding to the King County Executive and King County Council on an annual basis.
- G. Annual reports will be submitted to the executive and council.
- H. The cost of administering the King County Opportunity Grant Program shall be minimal.

SECTION 11. All programs and projects funded under this ordinance shall comply with Section 504 of the Federal Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended, and abide by current affirmative action laws and ordinances.

SECTION 12. The King County auditor shall conduct a performance and fiscal/compliance audit of the King County Arts and Cultural Education Program, the King County Arts and Cultural Tourism and Enrichment Program and the King County Opportunity Grant Program no later than 1994, and as necessary thereafter.

SECTION 13. Nothwithstanding the other provisions of this ordinance, the amount of current expense revenues in excess of the adopted 1990 budget revenue estimate of \$249,318,366 shall be allocated to replace up to \$646,141 of the \$1,086,314 hotel-motel tax revenues allocated to the current expense fund. Additional current expense fund revenues which are reimbursement for expenditures such as adult detention, public defense contracts, and so forth shall not be considered excess for purposes of this requirement.

SECTION 14. Severability. Should any section, subsection, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be
