3 AN ORDINANCE extending the deadline of the 4 temporary moratorium on the issuance of 5 building permits for facilities accessory to a permitted public utility facility and б 7 conditional use permits for radio frequency 8 electromagnetic transmitters and 9 appurtenances on Cougar Mountain and 10 amending Ordinance 7212 and K.C.C. 20.12.328, and declaring an 11 12 emergency.

- BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:
- 14 SECTION 1. Ordinance 7212, as amended and K.C.C. 20.12.328
- 15 are amended to read as follows:
- 16 Temporary moratorium Cougar Mountain. A. Findings. The
- 17 King County council finds that:
- 1. The location of radio frequency electromagnetic
- 19 transmitters and appurtenances grouped on Cougar Mountain to
- 20 form an antenna farm are a public health concern to the
- 21 residents of Cougar Mountain.
- 2. The department of parks, planning and resources has
- 23 begun a study of regulations governing the location of radio
- 24 frequency electromagnetic transmitters and appurtenances with
- 25 proposed revised regulations due for council consideration.
- B. Moratorium established. There is hereby established a
- 27 moratorium which prohibits the issuance, for the purpose of
- 28 radio frequency electromagnetic transmitters and appurtenances
- inside or within 1,000 feet of the exterior boundaries of
- 30 Cougar Mountain Antenna Farm as mapped on Attachment A, of
- 31 building permits for facilities accessory to a permitted public
- 32 utility facility as defined by K.C.C. 21.08.070 B, and of
- 33 conditional use permits as defined in K.C.C. 21.44.030. For
- 34 purposes of this chapter the term "radio frequency
- 35 electromagnetic transmitters" shall mean any antenna, facility
- 36 or equipment designed to generate radio waves within the
- 37 frequency range of 3 MH, to 100 GH,

- 1 C. Duration. The temporary moratorium shall be in effect
- 2 until the King County council adopts revised regulations for
- 3 radio frequency electromagnetic transmitters and appurtenances
- 4 or ((June 30,)) December 31, 1990, whichever occurs first.
- 5 This time extension is made in anticipation that the county
- · 6 executive will transmit the revised regulations by June 1,
 - 7 1990.
 - 8 D. Implementation. All bonafide applications for building
 - 9 permits for facilities accessory to permitted public utility
- 10 facilities and conditional use permits for radio frequency
- 11 electromagnetic transmitters and appurtenances pending as of
- 12 the effective date of this ordinance shall be processed in the
- 13 normal manner within normally prescribed deadlines. No new
- 14 applications for such permits as described in B. of this
- 15 section will be accepted by King County.
- 16 E. The department of parks, planning and resources shall
- 17 transmit a preliminary report on the study of regulations for
- 18 radio frequency electromagnetic transmitters and appurtenances
- 19 to the King County council by August 1, 1986.
- 20 <u>SECTION 2</u>. The county council finds as a fact and declares
- 21 that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary
- 22 for the immediate preservation of public peace, health or
