AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of Northeast Serpentine Place Petitioner: Dr. Theodore S. Peterson and Others V-1799

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of portions of Northeast Serpentine Place, hereinafter described.
- 2. The department of public works in compliance with the council's letter dated June 4, 1982 investigated the above named petition. The results were contained in a letter of denial to the petitioner dated December 20, 1982.
- 3. The petitioner appealed the recommendation made by the department of public works. The appeal was heard by the Facilities and Economic Development Committee, on Wednesday, July 27, 1983. The committee voted unanimously, with all members present, to grant the appeal made by the petitioner, contingent on compliance with the following conditions:
 - a. Dr. Peterson will deed to the county a 12-foot right-of-way running the full length of his property adjoining Northeast 175th Street. King County is now in receipt of a Warranty Deed from the petitioner
 - b. Dr. Peterson will furnish the department of public works with a letter of agreement signed by the other three owners of property fronting on the Serpentine Place cul-de-sac indicating their willingness to forego their interest in the vacation of any right-of-way on the north side of the centerline of Northeast Serpentine Place. King County is now in receipt of the letter of agreement dated September 20, 1986.
- 4. Pacific Northwest Bell Telephone Company required an easement over a portion of the proposed vacation area. The petitioner has provided evidence to King County that the easement has been recorded and the requirement is satisfactorily fulfilled.
- 5. Northeast Serpentine Place functions as a local access street serving just four residences in this vicinity. Streets of this type require a minimum of 48 feet of right-of-way. The maintained portion of this right-of-way lies mostly in the northern half. These facts coupled with the advantage of gaining additional right-of-way for Northeast 175th Street (a secondary arterial) supports the contention that the public would be benefited by the proposed vacation.
- 6. Northeast Serpentine Place has been a county maintained street for a considerable period of time. The vacation area, therefore, is classified "B Class" in accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759. King County is now in receipt of a check in the amount of \$1,165.00 from the petitioner. This amount was determined by multiplying the assessed value of the properties involved (\$2.11 per sq. ft.) times the excess of the property vacated minus the property deeded to King County (2,400 sq. ft., minus 1,848 sq. ft., or 552 sq. ft.), i.e. \$2.11 per sq. ft. x 552 sq. ft. = \$1,165.00.
