AN ORDINANCE making a supplemental appropriation of \$153,475 to the natural resources and parks division for wage increases for aquatics and summer beach extra help staff, and amending Ordinance No. 9221, Section 20, as amended.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted a supplemental appropriation of \$153,475 to the natural resources and parks division for wage increases for aquatics and summer beach extra help staff.

SECTION 2. Ordinance 9221, Section 20, as amended is hereby amended by adding thereto and inserting therein the following:

NATURAL RESOURCES AND PARKS - From the Current Expense Fund there is hereby appropriated to:

\$153,475

Provided that:

This appropriation shall be used to increase the starting wage for lifeguard staff at pools to \$6.00/hour, with wages for staff with seniority to increase proportionately. appropriation is also to be used to increase the wage for lifeguard staff at county beaches to a flat rate of \$7.50/hour. Beach manager salaries should be increased proportionately.

Dear Councilmember North:

I am writing in regard to Ordinance 9539, which made a \$153,475 appropriation to the Natural Resources and Parks Division for wages for aquatics and summer beach extra help staff.

I am signing this ordinance because I believe that there is an overwhelming need to provide increased salaries for aquatics and summer beach staff. I share your desire to reward these people for the important function they serve in protecting County residents. However, the ordinance approved by the Council appropriated \$38,000 more than I had requested and included a proviso that I do not believe I can comply with. This proviso states:

## "Provided that:

This appropriation shall be used to increase the starting wage for lifeguard staff at pools to \$6.00/hour, with wages for staff with seniority to increase proportionally. This appropriation is also to be used to increase the wage for lifeguard staff at County beaches to a flat rate of \$7.50/hour. Beach manager salaries should be increased proportionally."

According to advice I have received from the Prosecutor's Office and Personnel Division, it is inadvisable to pay differential rates for these positions. The duties of these positions are very similar, and payment at differential rates could expose the County to unfair compensation claims. I therefore do not believe I can comply with this proviso. Parks will pay an average starting rate of \$6.00 for all aquatics and beach staff (with proportional increases for

senior staff) but beach staff cannot be paid at the higher rate. I have instructed the Parks Division that the additional funds may not be spent for any other purpose and that the Council appropriation of these funds shall be allowed to lapse at the end of 1990.
