ORDINANCE NO. 9627

AN ORDINANCE making an appropriation of \$2,013,086 to a new Environmental Division in the Building and Land Development Fund from a transfer from the Current Expense fund in the amount of \$653,863, a transfer from Building and Land Development of \$836,337 and unappropriated fund balance of \$522,886; Amending Ordinance 9221, Sections 21, 37, 40, and 69, as amended, and adding a new section 96.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of \$2,013,060 to create a new invironmental Division within the Building and Land Development Fund from a transfer from the Current Expense Fund in the amount of \$653,863, a transfer from Building and Land Development in the amount of \$836,337, and unappropriated Building and Land Development fund balance of \$522,886.

SECTION 2. There is hereby approved and adopted an appropriation of \$653,863 to Transfer to Other Funds from Special Programs, Executive Contingency in the amount of \$139,144, and from Planning and Community Development - CX in the amount of \$514,719 to help support the creation of the Environmental Division.

The maximum number of FTEs for the Environmental Division shall be: 35.5 Provided further that:

Within 30 days of the effective date of this ordinance, the executive provides a detailed description of the duties of the personnel officer position to be created within the building and land development division and an explanation of the process by which this personnel officer will work with the personnel division, and

Provided further that:

Within one year of the effective date of this ordinance, the executive shall report to the council upon progress made in achieving the objectives of the reorganization of the parks, planning and resources department. That report shall include an identification and asssessment of the appropriate indicators to be used to assess the attainment of those objectives such as: a

1	substantial reduction in the number of vacant positions in BALD, increased
2	enforcement of county environmental regulations, or decreased waiting time for
3	counter service and permit processing.
