AN ORDINANCE relating to the department of adult detention; specifying county training policies for corrections officers to ensure the safe, secure and humane operation of jail facilities and programs.

PREAMBLE:
The King County Council recognizes the importance of appropriate training of corrections staff to operating the county jail and its programs in a safe, secure and humane manner. Such training is crucial to ensure the health and safety of those persons detained in county jail facilities as well as employees working in county jail facilities.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. The department of adult detention shall operate in accordance with the following policies:

A. An initial 120 hours of training will be provided after appointment in which the new corrections officer will be assigned to the training supervisor and will not be available for regular shift assignment. During this initial training period, the new corrections officer will be trained in the field of adult detention and corrections with attention given to the procedures and policies of the county jail.

0 B. Newly hired corrections officers will receive training
