ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE establishing a vehicle license fee for the purpose of funding general transportation improvements under the authority of Chapter 42, Session Laws of 1990 [Engrossed Substitute Senate Bill 6358].

PREAMBLE:

Ordinance 9635 establishing a vehicle license fee was adopted by the council on September 24, 1990 and approved by the executive on October 1, 1990. Or October 16, 1990 a citizen filed a proposed referendum petition regarding this fee with the Clerk of the Council. Although the citizen believed he was. entitled to submit the proposed referendum under the provisions of the King County Charter and Code, the proposed referendum was not timely filed under the provisions of Chapter 42, Session Laws of 1990, Section 214 which provides that such a referendum petition must be filed within seven days of passage of the ordinance and further that the procedure provided in Section 214 "is the exclusive method for subjecting any county or city ordinance imposing a tax or fee under Sections 206 and 208 of this act to The citizens' right to submit a a referendum vote." proposed referendum is too basic to our way of government to be frustrated by a misunderstanding of the applicability of various statutes. The council can allow the referendum process authorized by Section 214 of such laws to proceed by repealing Ordinance 9635 and re-enacting the fee and thereby providing a second opportunity for concerned citizens to file a proposed referendum petition.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Under the authority of Chapter 42, Session Laws of 1990, Section 206(1), there is hereby levied an annual fee of fifteen dollars per vehicle for each vehicle that is subject to license fees under RCW 46.16.060 and is determined by the Washington State Department of Licensing to be registered within the boundaries of the county. The effective date of the fee shall be July 1, 1991.

SECTION 2. The fee imposed by this ordinance shall be collected and administered by the Washington State Department of Licensing; the revenues from the fee imposed by this ordinance shall be distributed to the county and the cities; and the proceeds of the fee imposed by this ordinance shall be

used strictly for transportation purposes in accordance with 2 Chapter 42, Session Laws of 1990. 3 SECTION 3. For the purpose of this ordinance and any 4 proposed referendum on it, the clerk of the council shall be 5 the filing officer for the purpose of receiving a proposed 6 referendum petition, conferring with the petitioner regarding 7 form and style, and issuing an identification number for the The prosecuting attorney shall prepare the ballot 8 petition. 9 title and transmit it to the clerk of the council and the records and elections division. The records and elections 10 division shall fulfill all other duties of the filing officer, 11 12 including canvassing, counting and verifying signatures on the petition forms, and if sufficient valid signatures are properly 13 submitted, submit the referendum measure to the voters at an 14 15 election on a date which shall be determined by the council. SECTION 4.
