AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of portions of Sixth Place South, South 287th Street and Marine View Drive Petitioners: Federal Way Water and Sewer District and Others - V-2021

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of portions of Sixth Place South, South 287th Street and Marine View Drive, hereinafter described.
- 2. The department of public works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements were granted to Puget Power, U.S. West Telephone Company and the Federal Way Water and Sewer District.
- 3. The building and land development division has recommended that an easement for pedestrian access along South 287th Street be retained. A field check by the building and land development division staff found an existing footpath through the right-of-way. The Federal Way Water and Sewer District has agreed in principle with the need for pedestrian access through the site. They feel they cannot now sign an easement for themselves, and propose granting the easement when they sell the property. Roads division staff are opposed to the district's proposal.
- 4. RCW 36.871.140 allows the county legislative authority to retain such an easement within the ordinance authorizing a vacation. Road division staff think it is preferable for King County to retain a public pedestrian easement over the Northwest 15 feet of the Southwest half of the South 287th Street right-of-way, within this vacation ordinance.
- 5. The building and land development division also noted the existence of an access road near the segment of Sixth Place South that is proposed for vacation by this petition. Federal Way Water and Sewer District staff have assured roads division staff that the access road is on the portion of Sixth Place South that was previously vacated by the nearby condominum project. The district has had the property surveyed. The survey shows that all of the condominum's access improvements are outside of the area requested for vacation.
- 6. The department of public works found no evidence that the vacation area has ever been opened as a road. A search of the records indicates that no public funds have been expended for its acquisition, improvement or maintenance. The road is, therefore, classified "C Class" in accordance with King County Ordinance No. 2759.
- 7. The department of public works considers the subject right of way useless as part of the county road system and believes the public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.

In consideration of the benefits to be derived from the subject vacation, the council has determined that it is in the best interest of the citizens of King County to grant said petition.
