ORDINANCE NO. **10010**

AN ORDINANCE appropriating \$185,101 for implementation of a King County anti-gang strategy, and amending Ordinance No. 9720, Sections 15, 17, 20, 32, 36 and 46, as amended, and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. There are hereby approved and adopted the following appropriations: \$46,296 to the department of public safety; \$44,075 to the department of youth services; \$25,594 to human services/CSD/youth and family services network; \$55,838 to natural resources and parks; \$13,298 to the office of financial management; and a disappropriation of \$185,101 from special programs - executive contingency for the implementation of a King County anti-gang strategy.

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 9720, Section 17, as amended, is hereby amended by adding thereto and inserting therein the following:

PUBLIC SAFETY - From the Current Expense Fund there is hereby appropriated to:

Public Safety \$ 46,296

Provided that:

These funds are are used to hire no more than two positions in the gang unit for the purposes of further developing and beginning to implement the department of public safety's proposal for the executive's anti-gang strategy, in coordination with the office of financial management and the departments of youth services, human services and parks, planning and resources.

SECTION 3. Ordinance No. 9720, Section 20, as amended, is hereby amended by adding thereto and inserting therein the following:

2 hereby amended by adding thereto and inserting the following:

3 Office of Financial Management - from the current expense
4 fund there is hereby appropriated to:

5 Office of Financial Management \$ 13,298

7 This money shall be used to fund staff to coordinate the
8 development of an operational plan for the executive's anti-
9 gang strategy.

10 SECTION 7. Ordinance No. 9720, Section 36, as amended, is
11 hereby amended thereto and inserting therein the following:

12 SPECIAL PROGRAMS - EXECUTIVE CONTINGENCY - From the
13 Current Expense Fund there is hereby disappropriated from:

14 Special Programs - Executive Contingency (\$185,101)

15 Provided that:

16 The office of financial management shall convene and
17 coordinate a committee with representatives from the department
18 of public safety, department of youth services, department of
19 human services and department of parks, planning and resources
20 to develop an operational plan for the executive's anti-gang
21 strategy. This plan shall: 1) identify one department
22 responsible for coordinating the anti-gang strategy; 2)
23 provide a detailed implementation proposal for each department
24 including a work program and workload indicators for each
25 proposed function and, in the case of the police gang unit, a
26 response to the request in Motion No. 8214 to evaluate the
27 feasibility of transferring existing staff from other functions
28 and an explanation of what community-based police methods
29 entail and how they will be implemented; 4) outline ongoing
30 coordination processes between departments and with the
31 community at the community and regional levels; 5) describe
32 how implementation of the strategy will be monitored and
33 evaluated. The executive shall report back to the council by
34 August 1, 1991 with an operational plan and supplemental
35 appropriation for the anti-gang strategy.

1 Provided further that:

2 The director of Public Safety shall initiate discussions
3 with the Seattle Police Department, the Tacoma Police
4 Department, Everett Police Department and other public safety
5 agencies in the region to explore and identify opportunities
6 for coordinated or combined regional anti-gang response teams
7 and strategies and report back to the county council by August
8 1, 1991.

9 SECTION 8. The county council finds as a fact and
10 declares that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is
11 necessary for the immediate preservation of public peace,
12 health or safety or for the support of county government and
13 its existing public institutions.

14 INTRODUCED AND READ for the first time this 17th day
15 of June 1991.
