ORDINANCE NO. 10154

AN ORDINANCE relating to drug-free zones; establishing procedures for producing and filing maps depicting the locations and boundaries of public parks and of schools and 1000-foot zones surrounding schools for the purpose of enhanced penalties under state law for crimes involving the manufacture, sale, or delivery of controlled substances.

PREAMBLE:

The grave social harms that result from drug dealing are significantly aggravated when drug dealing occurs in or near places frequented by children since children, lacking mature judgment and sophistication, are particularly vulnerable to the activities of drug dealing and to the crimes of violence likely to occur in the dangerous criminal milieu which accompanies drug dealing. Children are commonly present without parental or other adult supervision on or near school grounds and in public parks. Since state law provides for substantially enhanced penalties to be imposed on persons who deal drugs in such locations it is in the public interest to recognize and to give public notice that such locations shall be considered drug-free zones.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Maps to be filed with clerk of council.

Pursuant to RCW 69.50.435, for the purpose of providing a public record of the location and boundaries of certain areas within which enhanced penalties shall be imposed upon conviction of unlawful transactions in controlled substances, any map depicting the location and boundaries of public parks and of the area on or within one thousand feet of any property used for schools which is produced or reproduced by the county executive or the engineer of any municipality or school district and approved by the governing body of such public agency may be filed with the clerk of the county council.

SECTION 2. Preparation of parks maps by county. The county executive is directed to prepare and submit to the council for approval by ordinance, maps showing the boundaries and locations, including municipal boundaries, of all lands in unincorporated King County which are operated as parks by the

state or by local government and of all county parks whether in incorporated or unincorporated areas of King County. The executive is directed to send a copy of this ordinance to each city and town in King County and to the Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission and to send a copy of each approved map to the commission and to each city or town within whose boundaries a park is depicted.

Request by school districts and private SECTION 3. schools for preparation of maps and posting of signs by King The county executive is directed to send a copy of County. this ordinance to each school district and each private school approved under RCW 28A.195.010 within King County. receipt by the executive of a resolution of the board of directors of the school district or of the governing body of a private school requesting that its school or schools be declared "drug-free zones" and mapped pursuant to RCW 69.50.435, together with information specifying the location of school grounds, the executive shall cause to be prepared maps depicting the location and boundaries of the area on or within one thousand feet of any property used for schools by such district or private school and depicting municipal boundaries, if any, within such area. Each such map or maps shall be transmitted by the executive to the council for its approval by ordinance. Following approval by ordinance, the executive shall cause to be posted within unincorporated areas signs delineating the boundaries of the 1000 feet "drug-free zone" surrounding each school in unincorporated King County whose location and boundaries have been mapped pursuant to this ordinance.

SECTION 4. Clerk to send notice and maintain file of maps. The clerk of the council shall send notice of adoption of each ordinance approving a map pursuant to sections 2 or 3 of this ordinance to the clerks of the district and superior courts, the office of the prosecuting attorney, and the police department of each jurisdiction within which each mapped school

or park is located. The clerk is directed to maintain a current file of all maps which are approved by the Council 2 pursuant to this ordinance. 3 SECTION 5. Severability.
