ORDINANCE NO.

AN ORDINANCE amending the duties and responsibilities of the King County Children and Family Commission, placing the commission under the responsibility of the office of financial management, budget division and amending Ordinance No. 8577, Sections 1, 2, 3, 4 and K.C.C. 2.50.010, 2.50.020, 2.50.030 and 2.50.040 and adding a new section.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance No. 8577, Section 1, and K.C.C. 2.50.010 are hereby amended as follows:

- A. There is established the King County children and family commission, to be composed of no more than seventeen voting members, appointed by the King County executive and confirmed by the council. Appointees shall represent the geographic and ethnic diversity of communities in King County. No more than seven members shall reside within any one municipal jurisdiction.
- B. The commission shall seek the opinions and ideas of educators, the business community, children services providers and agency representatives and other interested parties on issues considered by the commission. These persons shall be invited to participate in commission discussions ((on an ad hoe basis)).
- C. The commission members shall be appointed by the county executive, subject to confirmation by the county council. ((Appointees should include community leaders and decision-makers from both public and private sectors who are interested in improving services for families and children.

  The executive shall request nominations from each councilmember.)) Appointees should include professionals, consumers of county services, children/youth and individuals of

color and limited/non-English speaking individuals who are concerned about children and families.

- D. Appropriate county departments which serve the health, recreational, social, economic and criminal justice needs of children and families shall provide resource people who shall serve the commission in an advisory capacity.
- E. Once constituted, commission members shall establish terms of appointment by lot. Seven members shall serve one year; five members shall serve two years; and five members shall serve three years.
- F. Except for the initial term, all appointments shall be for three-year terms. Once confirmed by the council, commission members shall serve as voting members until reconfirmed or a successor is confirmed. Commission members may serve two consecutive terms.
- G. Any vacancies occurring in the membership of the children and family commission shall be filled for the remainder of the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointments.

SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 8577, Section 2 and K.C.C. 2.50.010 are hereby amended as follows:

Duties. The King County children and family commission shall act in an advisory capacity to the county executive and county council, focusing on recommendations to further define King County's mission, role, and goals in provision of services to children and families. ((In addition, the commission shall adopt a formal children and family policy plan for council consideration by July 1, 1990 which sets forth the principles, policies and strategies needed to guide King County's efforts on behalf of children and families, provided that strategies should encourage families, schools, educators, social service agencies, businesses, volunteers, youth and children serving organizations, and private foundations to work together for the benefit of children and families. Provided further that primary consideration be given to a goal of increasing

cooperation with public and private schools to increase the graduation of youth from high school (or attaining graduate equivalent degrees). Appropriate strategies to attain this goal may address youth at risk for social, physical, or psychological problems preventing success at school.))

The commission will concentrate on building links between the county's service systems, communities and schools. The commission will provide oversight and review of the county's systems that provide services to children and families; promote cooperation among departments, and evaluate the effectiveness of programs; and oversee implementation of polices adopted by the council concerning children and families.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 3. The commission shall develop a biennial plan for implementing a children, youth and family policy plan adopted by the council. The first implementation plan shall be presented for council review and approval by July 1, 1992. Subsequent implementation plan updates shall be developed on a biennial basis and presented for council review and approval beginning March 1, 1994. The biennial children, youth and family implementation plan shall include a status report on the health and welfare of children, youth, and families in King County as well as priorities, goals, and strategies to guide annual funding and work program decisions. In accordance with adopted policy and the biennial implementation plan, the commission shall review the budgets of county agencies serving children, youth, and families as part of the annual budget process for the purpose of making appropriate policy and resource allocation recommendations to the executive and council.

SECTION 4. Ordinance No. 8577, Section 3 and K.C.C.
2.50.030 are amended to read as follows:

Meetings -- Quorum. The King County children and family commission shall elect its officers, including a chair, vice-chair and such other officers as it may deem necessary. Such officers shall occupy their respective offices for a

period of one year. The commission may organize into 1 2 sub-committees as appropriate. The commission shall adopt 3 rules and administrative procedures for its own operation. Such rules shall include a definition of conflict of interest 4 5 issues coming before the commission and appropriate voting The commission shall adopt an annual work plan describing how it will fulfill its responsibilities. 7 children and family commission shall hold regular public 8 meetings at least quarterly. Records of the proceedings shall 9 be maintained. The commission shall issue an annual report to 10 the public on its activities. A quorum shall constitute a 11 majority of the commission's membership. Any member of the 12 commission who, without having been excused by the chair, fails 13 to attend three regularly scheduled commission meetings, shall 14 be removed and the position declared vacant by the appointing 15 authority. 16

SECTION 5. Ordinance No. 8577, Section 4 and K.C.C.
2.50.040 are amended to read as follows:

Staffing. ((The department of human resources)) The office of financial management, budget division, shall have lead responsibility, within available resources, for staffing the commission. Staff for the department will respond to the chair of the commission, assisting in the preparation of agendas, securing information and statistics as requested or required for commission projects, keeping members informed about meetings and tasks, communicating with the executive office
