It is the Council's intent to finance \$2 million of the Seattle Children's Theater Project and \$1.5 million of the Pacific Northwest Ballet's project with future Hotel/Motel tax collections.

PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

The county reasonably expects to reimburse the expenditures authorized herein for the Seattle Children's Theater and the Pacific Northwest Ballet facility with the proceeds of taxexempt bonds in an amount at least equal to such expenditures. This declaration of official intention is made pursuant to Section 1.103-18 of the Income Tax Regulations promulgated by the United States Department of the Treasury.

PROVIDED FURTHER THAT:

To ensure that the citizens of the region receive real economic value in consideration for the partial public funding of the construction of new facilities for the Seattle Children's Theater and Pacific Northwest Ballet, the Seattle Children's Theater and the Pacific Northwest Ballet shall be obligated to provide substantial benefits to the public. The Seattle Children's Theater and the Pacific Northwest Ballet shall undertake the following public benefit requirements, to the extent consistent with their functions and purposes.

- a. The Seattle Children's Theater and Pacific Northwest
 Ballet shall make their facilities their primary locations in
 King County for their operations, although the Seattle
 Children's Theater and Pacific Northwest Ballet may maintain
 such ancillary sites as it deems necessary;
- b. The Seattle Children's Theater and Pacific Northwest
 Ballet shall operate their facilities for the public good,
 recognizing the regional significance of the Seattle Center;
- c. The Seattle Children's Theater and Pacific Northwest Ballet shall provide opportunities for reduced rates, free services or free access, based on an annual plan negotiated

- Ballet shall conduct and promote educational and community outreach programs, such as the following examples:
- (i) Cooperative programs with regional public school districts and private schools to benefit the education of youth of the region through for example, teacher training, student workshops, and special tours;
 - (ii) Special training programs for youth; and
- (iii) High quality artistic and educational experiences for people of all ages and backgrounds;
- f. The Seattle Children's Theater and Pacific Northwest
 Ballet shall cause their facilities to be operated as a firstclass performing, exhibition or teaching facility worthy of
 public confidence and pride;
- g. The Seattle Children's Theater and Pacific Northwest
 Ballet shall, as reasonable and appropriate, affirmatively
 provide programs, performances, exhibitions and/or educational
 opportunities featuring a range of ethnic performers and arts
 and recruit audiences reflecting the ethnic and cultural
 diversity of the region;
- h. The Seattle Children's Theater and Pacific Northwest Ballet shall make available for reasonable public use auditoriums, meeting rooms or other public spaces in their facilities which are not otherwise regularly scheduled; and
- i. The Seattle Children's Theater and Pacific Northwest
 Ballet shall work to ensure, where practicable and feasible,
 that their facilities are designed and constructed for direct
 and ready access by television and radio.

The public benefit policies, including specific terms and conditions as to the scope of such benefits and how such policies will be implemented and achieved, shall be further
