AN ORDINANCE relating to the vacation of a portion of Southwest 104th Street in Council District No. 8 - V-2099.
Petitioners: Ronald and Mary Simosky and Others

STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 1. A petition has been filed requesting vacation of that portion of Southwest 104th Street hereinafter described.
- 2. The department of public works has notified the various utilities serving the area and has been advised that easements have been granted to Seattle City Light, Water District 45 and Southwest Suburban Sewer District.
- 3. The vacation petition has been modified to exclude that portion of right-of-way within the area common to the extensions of First Avenue Southwest and Southwest 104th Street. First Avenue Southwest and the portion of Southwest 104th Street lying easterly of First Avenue Southwest are county maintained roadways. The roads and engineering division opposed reducing these rights-of-way to less than the required sixty foot width. At the request of the petitioners per King County Code 14.40.030, the vacation area was further modified to exclude the northerly half of Southwest 104th Street.
- 4. The building and land development division has studied the proposed road vacation and finds that it would not be in conflict with the principles and purposes of the King County Comprehensive Plan and the specific plans in the vicinity of this proposed vacation.
- 5. The right-of-way to be vacated was dedicated as a public right-of-way in the plat of Commercial Street Addition and filed for record in 1890. Because of the early filing date, the right-of-way falls under the jurisdiction of an act passed by the first State Legislature during the session of 1889-90 (Laws 1889-90, Page 603, Section 32; Ballinger's Code 3803). This law stipulated that any dedicated right-of-way remaining unopened for public use for five years was automatically vacated and the authority for building that roadway was barred by the lapse of time. Although later repealed, the law, as revised, still affects all such roads filed prior to March 12, 1904. This ordinance formalizes the vacation of the right-of-way and removes the cloud on the title in favor of the adjoining properties.
- 6. The department of public works found no evidence that the vacation area has ever been open as a road. A search of the records indicates that no public funds have been expended for its acquisition, improvement, or maintenance. The road is, therefore, classified "D Class" in accordance with King County Code 14.40.060. King County is in receipt of \$200.00 from the petitioners.
- 7. The department of public works considers the subject right-of-way useless as part of the county road system, and believes the public would benefit by the return of this unused area to the public tax rolls.
