AN ORDINANCE removing a proposed amendment to Articles 2 and 6 of the King County Charter concerning the legislative branch and elections from the general election ballot, and repealing Ordinance 10212.

## PREAMBLE:

Ordinance 10212, adopted on December 23, 1991, proposed an amendment to the King County Charter to provide for a thirteen member council and intergovernmental committees to review countywide policy plans. The proposal was to be submitted to the voters at the general election on November 3, 1992 and the amendment would have been effective only if, in addition to it being approved by the voters of King County, the county assumed the functions of the Municipality of Metropolitan Seattle by judicial order or state legislation in 1992. No such state legislation was passed in 1992. No such judicial order has yet been issued or appears likely to be issued in the immediate future.

Hon. William Dwyer, U.S. District Court, Western District of Washington has ordered that effective April 30, 1993 only the members of the King County council and the executive may vote as members of the Metro Council unless through state legislation or voter approval a different governing body is provided for Metro. The order preserves the structure of Metro and does not cause King County to assume the functions of Metro and therefore even if the ballot measure were to be approved by the voters it would not take effect. It would be a useless gesture to submit to the voters the proposed charter amendment when the effect of the contingency clause means that it is extremely unlikely that the charter amendment ever would take effect.
