AN ORDINANCE authorizing emergency waiver of solid waste disposal fees for low-income senior citizens and low-income disabled persons in areas at high risk of arson and declaring an emergency.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Definitions:

- A. "Low-income senior citizen" means a person who is sixty-two years of age or older and whose total income, including that of his or her spouse or cotenant, does not exceed the amount specified in RCW 84.36.381 (5)(b), as now or hereafter amended.
- B. "Low-income disabled person" means a person whose income, including that of his or her spouse or cotenant, does not exceed the amount specified in RCW 70.164.020 (4) and who also is:
- a person qualifying for special parking privileges
 under RCW 46.16.381 (1) (a) through (f),
 - 2. a blind person as defined in RCW 74.18.020, or
- 3. a disabled, handicapped, or incapacitated person as defined under any other existing state or federal program.

SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of KCC ch. 10.12 relating to solid waste disposal fees, the county executive is authorized to allow waiver of fees for disposal of waste materials by low-income senior citizens and low-income disabled persons from residences in areas of King County which are at high risk of being susceptible of arson. Such waiver shall be effective for a period not to exceed one week, and shall commence as early as feasible but in any event prior to October 15, 1992. The executive is requested to develop plans for implementation of the waiver, including establishing a procedure for notification, scheduling, and utilization of the waiver.
