ORDINANCE NO. 10581

AN ORDINANCE relating to bidding procedures for public contracts, increasing the threshold for formal advertised solicitation processes for tangible personal property, services and public works projects, revising public advertising requirements, and creating a small works roster system; amending Ordinance 3441, Sections 3-6 and 8, as amended, and K.C.C. 4.16.030 through 4.16.060 and 4.16.090; amending Ordinance 4551, Section 2, as amended, and K.C.C. 4.16.080; and adding two new sections to K.C.C. 4.16.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

SECTION 1. Ordinance 3441, Section 3, as amended, and K.C.C. 4.16.030 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Exceptions to bidding for the <u>lease or</u> purchase of tangible personal property and services or the solicitation of ((bids)) proposals and subsequent purchase of professional and/or technical consultant services. In accordance with the provisions of R.C.W. 36.32.245, R.C.W. 36.32.253 and this chapter ((36.32.250)), the director or his designee is granted authority to let any contract, lease or purchase of tangible personal property or services (other than professional and/or technical consultant services) involving less than ((three-thousand-five-hundred)) twenty-five thousand dollars, without advertisement and without ((competitive)) formal, sealed bidding. The director or his designee is also granted the authority to let any contract for the purchase of professional and/or technical ((service consultants)) consultant services without a formal solicitation of proposal process where the value of the contract to the ((contractor)) consultant will not exceed ten thousand dollars. ((The director or his designee, is authorized to dispense with advertisement, competitive bidding, and solicitation of proposal processes when)) When leasing or purchasing tangible personal property or services (other than professional and/or technical consultant services) between ((one thousand)) two thousand five hundred dollars and ((three thousand

five hundred)) twenty-five thousand dollars, or when ((the)) awarding ((of)) a professional and/or technical service contract having a value to the ((contractor)) consultant of less than ten thousand dollars ((. The)) , the director or his designee shall be responsible for securing telephone and/or written quotations from enough vendors or prospective contractors or consultants $((\tau))$ to assure establishment of a competitive price, and for awarding such contracts ((for purchase of materials, equipment, or services)) to the lowest responsible bidder or proposer; provided, that in awarding professional and/or technical service contracts the director or his designee shall strive to select the most qualified ((bidder)) proposer, having given due regard to experience and expertise and other relevant factors ((-Immediately)); and provided further, that after the award ((is made)) of any contract pursuant to this section, the bid quotations or proposals obtained shall be recorded and open to public inspection and shall be available by telephone inquiry. SECTION 2. Ordinance No. 3441, Section 4, as amended, and K.C.C. 4.16.040 are hereby amended to read as follows: Proprietary purchases. The sealed competitive bidding

proprietary purchases. The sealed competitive bidding provisions of this chapter shall not apply to the lease or purchase of tangible personal property or to services of any kind which ((is)) are clearly and legitimately limited to a single source of supply, or to leases and purchases involving special facilities((7)) or market conditions, in which instances the lease or purchase price shall be established by direct negotiations with the department of executive administration. The county executive or his designee shall approve such leases or purchases in excess of ((three thousand five hundred)) twenty-five thousand dollars.

SECTION 3. Ordinance No. 3441, Section 5, as amended, and K.C.C. 4.16.050 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Emergency purchases. In the event of an emergency when the public interest or property of the county would suffer material

injury or damage by delay, upon declaring the existence of such emergency and reciting the facts constituting the same, the director or his designee may waive the requirements of Section 4.16.010 with reference to any ((purchase or)) contract relating either to the county's lease or purchase of tangible personal property or services or to ((and)) the requirements for the selection and award of professional and/or technical service consultant contracts; provided, that such exemption shall only apply to those contracts having a value of less than fifty thousand dollars to the ((consultant)) contractor or consultant. The executive shall report, in detail, such emergency expenditures to the county council within thirty days of declaring an emergency. Should an emergency require the expenditure of funds in excess of fifty thousand dollars, any such additional expenditure shall be approved by motion of the council, accompanied, if necessary, by an appropriations ordinance, declaring an emergency, following the executive's recommendation. The executive's recommendation shall include such statements as are necessary to fully explain the emergency. Purchases/contracts involving an emergency circumstance shall be approved by the county executive or his designee when the cost exceeds ((three thousand five hundred)) twenty-five thousand dollars; provided, that no contract or purchase shall be consummated to expend any money or incur any liability in excess of amounts appropriated by ordinance.

SECTION 4. Ordinance No. 3441, Section 6, as amended, and KCC 4.16.060 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Counter bids. Notice of the lease or purchase((s)) of tangible personal property and the purchase of services (other than professional and/or technical consultant services) between ((one thousand)) two thousand five hundred dollars and ((three thousand-five-hundred)) twenty-five thousand dollars shall be posted on a bulletin board of the department of executive

administration for not less than three days prior to making such 1 2 <u>lease or</u> purchase ((, lease, or contract)). Quotations will be obtained by telephone and/or in writing from enough vendors or 3 prospective contractors to assure establishment of competitive 4 prices and for awarding such contracts for lease or purchase of 5 materials, equipment or services to the lowest responsible bidder. 6 Immediately after award is made, the bid quotations obtained shall 7 be recorded and open to public inspection and shall be available 8 by telephone inquiry. 9 1.0

SECTION 5. Ordinance No. 4551, Section 2, as amended, and KCC 4.16.080 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Rules and regulations for the solicitation and purchase of professional and/or technical service consultant contracts.

- A. The rules and regulations stipulated in this section shall apply only to professional and/or technical service consultant contracts in which the county enters into an agreement to purchase consultant services for county government from a corporation, firm, agency, individual, or group of individuals based on their recognized experience and knowledge within a specialized area of expertise. Examples of such consultant services subject to this chapter include, but are not limited to, the following:
 - 1. Financial or administrative studies;
 - 2. Feasibility studies of a scientific or technical nature;
 - 3. Architectural services, including landscape, architectural, and engineering, as well as other design studies;
 - 4. Special project management for a defined period of time or result;
 - 5. Management advisory services; ((-)) and
 - 6. Services requiring special knowledge, training, or advanced education, and involving mental or

intellectual, rather than physical or manual, labor or skill, and involving the consistent exercise of judgment and discretion in a specific field or endeavor.

- B. Consultant contracts for preparation of environmental documents prepared as required by the State Environmental Policy Act, RCW 43.21C, are exempt from the requirements of this chapter.
- C. In soliciting and ultimately awarding a professional and/or technical services consultant contract, having a value to the contractor in excess of ten thousand dollars, the director or his designee, shall have the operational responsibility to:
- Develop ((bid)) proposal specifications or a project description in the form of a request for proposal in concert with the requesting county agency;
- 2. Develop, with the requesting agency, the written criteria which will be used to determine which written proposal shall be accepted as the basis for recommending contract award. Such determination at a minimum shall include:
 - a. Quality;
 - b. Known and documented expertise of the applicant;
 - c. Documentation, as required, and demonstration of the financial capability of the party to perform specified work;
 - d. Special consideration of the impact of affirmative action, including minority <u>and women's</u> business ((contracting)) <u>enterprise participation</u>.
- 3. Publicly advertise at least ((twice,)) once ((and)) at least ((once, two consecutive weeks in advance)) ten days prior to the last date upon which proposals will be received, the purpose, scheduled date, location, and time of a prebid conference, or the name of a contact person within the issuing authority from which the project specifications shall be available. The purposes of prior notification shall be to distribute and discuss the project

specifications in the form of a request for proposal to interested parties, and inform applicants of the stated time frame for submission;

- 4. Recommend to the county executive which proposal, therefore party, should be awarded a contract as being in the best interests of the county; provided, that in the event the county fails to negotiate satisfactory terms with the highest ranked proposed ((contractor)) consultant, the executive shall then begin negotiations with the next highest ranked ((contractor)) proposed consultant, and so forth until such time as a contract satisfactory to the county is executed or the process is terminated by the county;
- 5. Be responsible to address all necessary comments to other applicants, interested parties, or the general public regarding the decision by the county to contract for services from a party to the exclusion of other applicants.

SECTION 6. Ordinance No. 3441, Section 8, as amended, and K.C.C. 4.16.090 are hereby amended to read as follows:

Rules and regulations for the lease or purchase of tangible personal property and the purchase of services other than professional and/or technical consultant services. The director or the director's designee shall have prepared and shall approve and advertise for bids of all county solicitations for the lease or purchase of tangible personal property and the purchase of services (other than professional and/or technical consultant services) in excess of ((three thousand five hundred)) twenty-five thousand dollars, and such solicitations shall be consistent with applicable state of Washington statutes, including R.C.W.

36.32.245, R.C.W. 36.32.253 and R.C.W. 39.04.190. All ((orders)) purchases or contracts made by the director or the director's designee shall be awarded to the lowest ((qualified)) responsible bidder ((, taking into consideration the quality of the material or services to be supplied, their conformity with the

specifications, their suitability to the requirements of the county-government, and the delivery terms)). Any or all bids may be rejected for good cause.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 7. There is added to K.C.C. 4.16 a new section to read as follows:

Waiver of advertisement and competitive bidding for certain public works projects. In accordance with R.C.W. 36.32.250, advertisement and competitive bidding shall be dispensed with in the letting of contracts for public works involving less than ten thousand dollars.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 8. There is added to K.C.C. 4.16 a new section to read as follows:

Small Works Roster Alternative to Advertisement and Competitive Bidding. There is hereby created a small works roster system, which shall operate as a uniform process to award contracts for public works projects with an estimated value of one hundred thousand dollars or less as an alternative, at the option of the county on a project-by-project basis, to formal advertisement and competitive bidding. The following procedures shall be followed in awarding all contracts using this roster system:

- (A) Individual rosters within the system shall be composed of all contractors who have requested to be placed thereon and who are, where required by law, properly licensed to perform such work in this state;
- (B) The county shall actively solicit participation by womenowned and minority-owned business enterprises in accordance with the provisions of K.C.C. 4.18;
- (C) Whenever possible, the county shall by invitation seek bids from at least five separate contractors on an appropriate roster. Such invitation shall include an estimate of the scope and nature of the work to be performed as well as the materials and equipment to be furnished;

Once a contractor on a roster has been offered an opportunity (D) 1 2 to submit a bid, that contractor shall not be offered another opportunity to submit a bid for any other contract utilizing that 3 same roster until all other contractors thereon, including women-4 owned and minority-owned contractors, have been afforded an 5 opportunity to submit a bid; and 6 A contractor shall be removed, at the discretion of the 7 manager, from a small works roster after being deemed non-8 responsible to two consecutive invitations to bid. 9 (F) All contracts shall be awarded to the contractor submitting 10 the lowest responsible bid. 11 The director or his designee shall be responsible for the 12 administration of the small works roster system and shall prepare 13 14 and adopt the forms, administrative processes and operational procedures necessary to implement a small works roster system for 15 different categories of anticipated work that complies fully with 16 this section and all applicable requirements of state law, 17 including those set forth in R.C.W. 36.32.250 and R.C.W. chapter 18 39.04. 19 20

NEW SECTION. SECTION 9. The present limit of \$1,000 on direct voucher purchases by individual departments shall not exceed that limit without approval by ordinance passed by the Council.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 10. It shall be the responsibility of the office of financial management to report to the Council no later than April 30th of each year direct voucher activity for the previous year on a department by department basis. Said report shall include, but not be limited to, an identification of
