ORDINANCE NO. **10593** 1 1

1 AN ORDINANCE adopting the 1992
2 Transportation Needs Report and amending
Ordinance No. 9153, Sections 1-5.

3 PREAMBLE:

4 In accordance with the provisions of King County Ordinance 9153, Section
5 4; the 1991 Transportation Needs Report was updated to incorporate
6 community plan revisions, additional functional plan elements, other
7 local and regional transportation plans and studies, and other
information available to the county road engineer. These efforts
culminated in the 1992 Transportation Needs Report which provides an
updated list of transportation projects to act as a guide for the
implementation of the King County Transportation Plan.

8 BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF KING COUNTY:

9 SECTION 1: Ordinance 9153, Sections 1-5, as amended and K.C.C.

10 20.12.430 as amended are hereby amended to read as follows:

11 A. The King County Transportation Plan consists of the following
12 elements:

13 1. Policy element, consisting of the transportation-related
14 policies from the King County Comprehensive Plan 1985, and the
15 transit/ridesharing/rail policy actions.

16 2. The arterial functional classification report.

17 3. The transportation priority process ~~((; -Exhibit-A-to-Ordinance~~
18 ~~10229, -dated-June, -1991-))~~

19 4. The ~~((1991))~~ 1992 transportation needs report ~~((; -Exhibit-B-to~~
20 ~~Ordinance-10229-dated-June, -1991-))~~

21 5. The implementation strategy report, as amended.

22 B. The council finds that the King County Transportation Plan
23 environmental impact statement is adequate to support adoption of the King
24 County Transportation Plan.

25 C. The King County Transportation Plan, dated October 1989, is adopted
26 as the functional plan implementing the transportation policies established
27 by the King County Comprehensive Plan. As an amplification and augmentation
28 of the King County Comprehensive Plan, it constitutes official county policy
29 with regard to surface transportation issues.

1 D. The King County Transportation Plan's elements dealing with
2 "Transportation Needs Report" and "Arterial Functional Classification" shall
3 be subject to an annual review and update process preparatory to the capital
4 improvement program budgeting process. Updates shall incorporate community
5 plan revisions, additional functional plan elements, other local and
6 regional transportation plans and studies, and other information available
7 to the county road engineer, and shall include public review and information
8 in the annual review of the updates. The department of public works shall
9 provide an update report to the executive and council on these elements by
10 May 31 of each year, identifying possible changes to the needs lists or
11 arterial classifications, and why these changes are needed.

12 E. The Transportation Plan shall be implemented through:

- 13 1. Adoption of an annual six-year capital improvement program.
 - 14 2. Application of the Road Adequacy Standards, K.C.C. Chapter
15 21.49.
 - 16 3. Application of the mitigation payment system, when adopted.
 - 17 4. Mitigation of transportation impacts as required and authorized
18 under the State Environmental Policy Act.
 - 19 5. Road maintenance and traffic operating improvements.
 - 20 6. Pursuit of additional funding sources at the local, state and
21 federal levels whenever possible.
 - 22 7. Participation by the county in regional efforts to enhance bus
23 transit usage and development of a rail/high capacity transit system.
 - 24 8. Establishment of a system for reviewing proposed developments
25 for their impacts on equestrian, pedestrian and bicycle traffic and
26 requiring mitigation when adverse impacts will occur.


1 9. Development of transportation system management techniques,
2 zoning code changes, and road improvements to enhance the use of transit and
3 increase vehicle occupancy.

4 10. Coordination of plans, projects, programs and policies with
5 other governments.


